CHECKLIST: Start Your Acting/Creative **Sole Proprietorship**

PHASE 1: Foundation

1. Decide on Your Business Name

- Use your own name (e.g., *Jane Smith*)
- Or choose a brand name (e.g., Smith Creative, The Actor's Toolbox)

2. File a DBA ("Doing Business As")if needed

- Only needed if using a name other than your own
- File with your county clerk or state business office
- Cost: ~\$25–\$75 depending on location

3. Get an EIN from the IRS (recommended)

- Apply free online: <u>irs.gov</u>
- Use for taxes, business bank account, and privacy

4. Open a Business Bank Account

- Use your EIN and DBA (if applicable)
- Keeps finances separate and clean
- Optional: Get a business debit/credit card

5. Set Up a Way to Get Paid

• Options: Stripe, PayPal Business, Venmo Business, Bonsai, Calendly

• Adds professionalism to coaching, classes, or selling digital products

PHASE 2: Money & Taxes

6. Start Tracking Income & Expenses Options:

- Spreadsheet (ask for a template)
- Free tools: Wave, Bonsai, Notion

7. Estimate Quarterly Taxes (Optional for Now)

- Required if earning \$1,000+ in profit per year
- Talk to a tax pro when income rises

8. Save for Taxes (20-30%)

- Use a tool like Qapital or a separate savings account
- Helps avoid surprise tax bills

9. Create a Simple Website or Landing Page

- Tools: Linktree, Carrd, Notion
- Include services, bio, and contact/booking info

10. Define Your Offer(s)

What can you monetize now or soon?

- o 1-on-1 coaching
- Self-tape reviews
- o Digital products (eBooks, prompt packs)
- Workshops or classes

11. Brand Your Socials (Optional)

- Claim usernames across IG, YouTube, TikTok
- Use consistent branding

12. Monthly Review Habit

- Track income & expenses
- Set 1–2 goals for growth each month

BONUS: Selling Products or Services

Sales Tax Permit (if needed)

Required for selling taxable goods/services (varies by state)

Write a Basic Client Agreement

- Especially for coaching/workshops
- Ask for help drafting if needed
