

A SHORT STORY OF THE CALAMONDA MERINO OPERATION

Kym Williams started with 325 ewes and 7 rams in the fall of 2016 to build his flock. Pat Knight was hired about the same time as his secretary/bookkeeper. She handles the finances in consultation with him and does all the flock record keeping. Kym does most of the physical work with the sheep. In the early days of the operation, Pat helped as much as she could outside with the sheep including feeding and watering daily.

Each sheep carries an ear-tag from birth to death or culling whichever comes first, every sheep's information is carried through its lifetime which we refer to as their genetic information. From these records, Kym knows what ewe and which ram sired that lamb. That lamb is weighed usually within two hours of birth and recorded. The birthdate, mother, father, birth weight and siblings is recorded for future reference.

At three months, the lambs are usually weaned, weighed again, and recorded. Kym will weigh some of the rams later for weight-gain information.

Kym does all our shearing and I am the wool handler. There are only the two of us. During the shearing, I pull a wool sample and send the samples to the University of Montana for OFDA 2000 machine analysis. Each animals' wool production in weight is also recorded. The test sample tells us the micron, the variation, the comfort factor and the length. That analysis also goes into the records.

When Kym is preparing for breeding season, he takes the records of the ewes, separate from the rams, and studies them for grouping into lots of 30 or so and then matches those ewes as closely as he can to the ram that he selects for that mob of ewes.

This system works well when we keep our flock around 200 to 300 animals. At one point we were up to 1500 ewes and that was very difficult to manage, besides providing them with sufficient feed in both summer and winter. Once, we cut the flock back, he has had much better success following this system.

Editor's Note: some guild members benefited from this work. Several of us bought some of the 2025 wool clip from lambs born in February 2024 and shorn this April 2025.



GETTING TO ALL SAINTS' EPISCOPAL CHURCH on 4201 West Washington Avenue, LV:

FROM SOUTH & EAST VALLEY: (Take I-15 North to) US 95 North, exit Valley View Blvd. and turn right. Turn left onto Washington Avenue when Valley View ends (about one quarter mile). All Saints' is about half a mile west on the left. FROM WEST & NORTH VALLEY: (Take Summerlin Parkway west to) US 95 South, exit Decatur Blvd. North (exit after Decatur South, watch the signs!). Go north about half a mile and turn right onto Washington Ave. All Saints' is about half a mile east on the right.

Whichever direction you come from, PAY ATTENTION ONCE YOU TURN ONTO WASHINGTON. The church is on the southeast corner of Washington and Glen Abby Court, but it's difficult to see until you're right next to it. PARKING is available on Glen Abbey Court street and in the parking lot including in back of the church. If you have a long vehicle, consider parking on the street as the lot is not very deep. Parking in the back is closest to the meeting rooms (Parish Hall). Enter the campus in front through the red gate and follow the signs to the Parish Hall (across the courtyard toward the right). The Guild logo will be also posted to show you where to go. If you park in the back, enter through the door with the Guild logo. **Doors open 8:45 am.** https://allsaintslv.com/
