

ACTIVITIES & PROGRAMS:

After the business meeting, about 9:45 am, Dani will present her Navajo Churro Wool Study. We will be taking an up-close look at Navajo-Churro wool and discussing the best way to process it for various fiber arts crafts. Navajo-Churro sheep have a dual coat with a coarse outer coat and a softer undercoat. Most of what you find prepared is a mix of both coats. We will be looking at clean locks to see both coats. There will be wool supplied so that you can practice separating the coats. This can be done by hand, or with combs. Locks that are on the shorter side can also be carded, either all together or by separating out the undercoat and carding that by itself. If you are looking for a softer yarn or want to do a felting project, the undercoat is what you want. Please feel free to bring combs, hand cards, and/or a spindle to help you get the most out of this mini-workshop.

Minutes of the February 14, 2026 Meeting

A meeting of the Southern Nevada Handweavers and Spinners Guild, Inc. was held on February 14, 2026, at Good Samaritan Lutheran Church (The Lakes campus) in person and on Zoom.

Two members attended on Zoom.

In Rich's absence, Dani called the meeting to order at 9:10 and welcomed members & guests. We now have name tags, so that should help with learning everyone's names. Dani reminded us to pick them up from the refreshment table and return them there at the end of the meeting.

Approval of Minutes: Charles moved the January minutes be accepted as published. The motion was seconded by Sue and the motion passed unanimously.

REPORTS:

Treasurer and Membership: Cinda reported that the Guild checking account currently has \$7,409.08, of which \$1,365 is reserved for the Annie MacHale workshop in May.

Committee Reports

Newsletter - Hermi reported that she is collecting pictures, tidbits of useful information, and internet links for the March newsletter. She reminded us that she is going to be changing the computer program she used to format and publish the newsletter by Fall. She appreciates any information about easy-to-use programs. Canva has been suggested. She is also interested in giving up writing the newsletter after 8 years of responsibility for this vital job in our guild. Besides letting every member know what's going on, giving them weaving, spinning and other fiber arts information, it serves as the historical record of our Guild activities.

Workshops – Meg reminded us again about Annie MacHale's Inkle Workshops May 1-3. This is formatted as 3 one day workshops – from beginning to more specialized. If you are comfortable warping your inkle loom and following written drafts, it is not necessary to take the first day...though you'd pick up useful information. Meg has started a waiting list for days 1 and 2, and there is currently 1 opening for day 3. See Meg if you have any questions.

Jillian Moreno is scheduled to present a three-day spinning workshop Nov 13-15. This is not a beginner's class. If you have any doubts about your spinning level, please talk to Janet. There is plenty of time to brush up your skills before November: come to the Wednesday spin-ins at Sahara West Library and ask someone for coaching....as Janet said there are plenty of 'spinning ena-

blers' in our midst! This workshop is scheduled for a Guild meeting weekend, and different options are being considered – stay tuned for further information!

Programs - Maria reported that all the programs for each meeting through June are set up: In March Dani will talk about Navajo churro sheep, April is a Zoom talk about inkle weaving, May is our annual Guild meeting and brunch, and in June, Hermi will be teaching a card weaving mini-workshop, also known as tablet weaving. She is planning to show patterns for beginners but also for advanced card weavers that can be done within the one-hour program. Maria is close to having next year's meeting talks lined up too!

Raffle – There is no raffle without Ginny! Bring your money next month!

Historian – Elaine is looking for a replacement for the position of Guild Historian. Please contact her for a description of the position – it's not difficult!

Web and Social Media – Sue is going to upload the last recorded lecture shortly – this is the one from January's meeting with TJ King on supported spindles. She also said that the debit card is attached to the website so that the website fees can be auto paid.

Equipment and Library – Janet, wearing her Equipment hat, reminded us that we have three 8s table looms, and an 8s baby wolf available to rent for \$35/month. We also have a bobbin winder and a Marudai for rent for \$5/month. Consult the website for a complete list. As usual, she brought some books from the Guild's library – feel free to take something interesting home: sign it out on the clipboard and bring it back next month. And if you wonder what is available to borrow, consult Library Thing: directions for use are in every newsletter and on the website, behind the member paywall.

Study Groups and Continual Educational Demonstrations:

Spinning Circle is at Sahara West Library on Wednesdays at 10 am. Everyone is welcome!

RH Study Group – this group is starting a new study. Maria is leading the group, so if you are interested in joining, please send her an email. Their first meeting, at the Sahara West library, will be on Tuesday, Feb 24 from 10-12, and every last Tues of the month after.

Scientific Dye Study Group is having an organizational meeting after today's guild meeting.

Demo at the Mormon Fort April 18. It starts at 9 and runs until 1pm, come by any time for as long as you want to stay. You can knit, spin, weave, whatever you'd like to do.... we're there to show people some of the age-old fiber arts that existed in the early days of Nevada's settlement.

- **Inkle Loom Workshop by Annie MacHale**



Annie MacHale uses mostly Omega Sinfonia cotton yarn, it is about 20 wraps per inch. Sinfonia can be ordered from her directly, or you may find it locally. Your Editor is still researching.

New Business:
