

A meeting of the Southern Nevada Handweavers and Spinners Guild, Inc. was held on March 13, 2021, on Zoom, due to Covid 19 Pandemic.

President Janet Mayers called the meeting to order at 9:10.

Approval of Minutes: February 2021 minutes were unanimously approved as written after it was moved by Charles and seconded by Diana.

REPORTS

Treasurer and Membership Report: We have \$7,457.30 in our treasury, of which \$1,534.79 is reserved for the Bobbie Irwin workshop and \$1200 for the Denise Kovnat workshop. **Membership**: we have had 2 new members in the past month, Stephany Truesdell and Sue Wainscott.

Newsletter: Hermi reported that she wants to make some changes to 'beef up' the newsletter. To do this, she plans on adding pictures from our Show and Tell from the previous month's guild meeting so that everyone can see what our members are accomplishing. She will continue the Online Inspirations, plans to find some interesting articles from past newsletters (some of which might pre-date any current members), and requests that contributions to the newsletter be sent as soon as possible, 2-3 weeks before. She works on the newsletter about 10 days before the meeting and it is difficult to insert anything at the last minute!

Programs: Maurine reminded us that Deborah Silver will give a lecture in April: "Split-Shed Tied Beiderwand." Maurine has previously suggested checking out her video on YouTube. We have a workshop scheduled with Kathrin Weber in October on Turned Taquete. And it was announced during our breakout session after Show and Tell that the Bobbie Irwin workshop will be September 24-26, 2021.





Virtual Workshop with Denise Kovnat (continued)

Fifteen (15) weavers gathered on Zoom for a workshop on Parallel threading - Echo, Jin and 4cDW (4 color DoubleWeave: 3 days, spread over 3 weekends....and it was wonderful! We couldn't touch each other's fabrics, or see Denise's amazing samples, or share wefts, enjoy each other's company, or sample Lance's wonderful coffee after lunch. BUT there were some pretty nice compensations:

- We shared pictures and discussed our sampling in class, and we have access to those pictures, the threadings, tie-ups, and treadlings on Google drive.
- Denise shared articles on Google drive about Jin, Echo, network drafting, and the original book (in French!) that inspired Alice Schlein to investigate Network Drafting and then broadcast her amazing discoveries to the weaving world almost 30 years ago. We also had some pretty wonderful color wheels to look at as well as a listing of color resources.
- All the lectures were taped, so we can go back and watch them again and again!
- And we got to weave as much as we wanted between lectures....so for 11 days, we had no lecture, but the ability to weave from the comfort of our home on our best loom. For me, that meant I could weave on my 24 shaft dob-

by loom and I wove over 10 feet, 32 different samples!

• Did I mention that 5 of our weavers were from Utah, 1 from Cleveland, Ohio, 1 from Tacoma, Washington, and 8 from Las Vegas!

• And Denise complimented us on our creativity and how prolific we were in our sampling!!

To be honest, I wouldn't mind taking more workshops on Zoom....and in person when it's safe!
