

Southern Nevada Handweavers & Spinners Guild, Inc. Minutes of the May 13, 2023 Meeting

A meeting of the Southern Nevada Handweavers and Spinners Guild, Inc. was held on May 13, 2023, in person at All Saint's Episcopal Church. (Zoom was available, but no one joined)

Attending in-person were: Charles Parker, Cinda Towne, Elizabeth LaRue, Vicki Johnson, Diana Smith, Hermi Hiatt, Nora Barry, Mina Campos, Sue Wainscott, Lianna Fitzpatrick, Elaine Eggink, Audrey Strehlow, Maurine Adrezin, Lorelle Nelson, Janet Mayers, Birgit Kefalas, Isar King, Jerry Magner, Elaine Morris, and Jami Johnson.

President Janet Mayers called the meeting to order at 9:20 am.

Approval of Minutes: Charles moved and Lorelle seconded that we approve the April minutes. The motion was unanimously approved.

REPORTS

Treasurer and Membership Report: Cinda reported that we have \$2,739.19 in our checking account. She reminded us that Dues are due now! And she reminded us that dues are now \$25 for everybody. She also requested that, if you want to be reimbursed, any expenses for January thru June are due by the June meeting. We are getting new members, several due to Maurine's teaching: in order to use a Guild loom, membership is required. The annual tax return was filed on May 1.

Newsletter: Janet complemented Hermi on a good newsletter with great photos! And Jami liked Cinda's book review. Hermi said the annual financial report will be in the June newsletter. Next month the minutes from the recent Board meeting will be published.

Programs: Maurine is still looking for ideas for teachers to bring in or for on-line teaching. Please let her know any suggestions. She is teaching Beginning Weaving to students in her home: the student rents a Guild loom (after the student joins), Maurine charges \$200, all supplies included, as long as it takes for the student to learn the material.

Hospitality: Vicki invites everyone to enjoy the goodies in the back.

Raffle: Liz is running the raffle today – please buy tickets!

Historian: Monique is not present and there is no report.

Web and Social Media: The website looks great! Diana reminded everyone to look at the 'Members only" section – if you haven't signed in yet, please do so. She also said there is still work being done 'behind the scenes'.

Equipment and Library: Library: There are a few things in the back to check out. Nothing new to report on our equipment – check out the website.

Study Groups: Remember that the Spinning group meets 10 am Wednesdays at Sahara library. 10-12 people are coming

every week, including a 14 year old young man who shows up regularly and is learning to spin and knit with his handspun wool!! The Rigid Heddle study group: We now have two active study groups meeting on the first Wednesday morning of the month at Laurie Ruben's home and Sunday afternoon at Janet's home: usually the 2nd Sunday afternoon, but May 21 this month (May 14 is Mother's Day).

IWC: July 27-30 in Logan, UT. Nancy Belian's son is making a wooden box in Nancy's memory to hold our donations....and we still need donations for the box! And Janet is still collecting bookmarks for the welcome table.

Community Outreach and Exchange: May 17 from 10am to noon, there will be a weaver from Mexico demonstrating backstrap weaving. Patty Dominguez is encouraging our guild members to come and bring examples of our work to share with this visiting weaver. Even if we don't speak Spanish, we all speak the same 'language' of fiber!

The Pioneer Day demonstration will be on September 30th (Saturday) at Spring Mountain Ranch. Nevadaween will be at the Old Mormon Fort in October. The Fort would also like to have us demonstrate spinning, weaving, etc., which we will probably do on June 3.

Fiber Festivals: Flag Wool and Fiber in Flagstaff, AZ on June 2-3: lots of stuff for sale! Great Basin Fiber Arts Fair was April 28-29 in Farmington, UT. Stephanie Peters went to it.

Textile Art Consortium: Isar reminded us that our Guild is a member of the Textile Arts Council in San Francisco. They have lectures online. https://www.textileartscouncil.org/ (Editor: if you're going to San Francisco, check out the website, there might be some exhibits in the area you'd like to see!)

Annual Meeting will be June 10th at our regular meeting time and place. Officers for the next board will be elected. The proposed slate is: President – Rich Deppe; Vice President – Janet Mayers; Treasurer – Cinda Towne; Secretary – Jami Johnson. There will be a Potluck Brunch, so bring something tasty! There will also be a Fashion Show of any kind of handmade items.

Policies and Procedures: The Board held a meeting last month and we wanted to remind members of several items in the Bylaws: 1) Workshop refunds policy is that there are no refunds for workshops within 60 days of the workshop. 2) A member must have been a member for one year before they can run for elected office. 3) Anyone on the nominating committee or a committee chairperson must be a member of the Guild.

Adjourn: There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:00 am.

SOUTHERN NEVADA HANDWEAVERS & SPINNERS GUILD, INC. Minutes of Board Meeting— April 23, 2023

A meeting of the Board of Southern Nevada Handweavers and Spinners Guild, Inc. was held on Zoom on April 23, 2023 starting at 2 pm.

Those attending were: Janet Mayers, President; Ginny Deppe, Vice-President; Cinda Towne, Treasurer; Jami Johnson, Secretary; Hermi Hiatt, Newsletter Editor; and Diana Smith, Zoom Master and Web Development

Items on Agenda and discussion:

SAM – **grants applications:** The SAM.gov (System for Award Management) registration is a first step in the ability to access any level of government art funding. We have done this in the past, but currently are not. The question is: do we need to continue the registration? After some discussion, it was decided to continue registration for another year, Jami will time the registration process (due in June) and report to the board. The issue will be revisited before the 2024 renewal.

Website, PayPal and change of owner from Janet to Guild: In order to change the ownership of our GoDaddy website, currently owned by Janet, we need to register another financial guarantor. Cinda, Diana, and Janet will co-ordinate this process, using the Guild's debit card as the guarantor, and hopefully using the Guild as a the owner, or the position of the Guild President. Ginny will contact Ventura Guild, who also uses GoDaddy, to see how they have handled this. Diana will also investigate the possibility of allowing the website to direct emails received for a position to be directed behind the scenes to that person: an email directed to President@LVFiberarts would arrive in Janet's email box!

Should we get a Paypal account for the Guild? Cinda reported that to do this we would have to submit paperwork proving our

non-profit status, and while we would have reduced rates it is not free. For example, for a \$25 annual membership, there would be a 99 cent fee. After discussion, we decided that we will do nothing now, revisit the issue next year, and keep our ears open to membership interest in having this option available.

May program: Janet proposed that we have a 'potluck' of different projects that could be used as demo and kid-friendly weavealong projects when members of the Guild interact with the community. We have supplies in the locker to do this: warped DVD's, cardboard looms, 'fill the gap' disks, and lots of acrylic yarn. Hermi will do a write-up for the May newsletter.

Slate of candidates for next year, election committee: President: Rich Deppe; VP: Janet Mayers; Treasurer: Cinda Towne; Secretary: Jami Johnson.

Storage locker price increase: We are currently paying \$78/mo for locker and insurance. This will be going up to \$83 shortly. We will keep the locker for the time being, but work towards reducing the need for one.

Cotton spinning workshop? Julie Dogsvold: Not sure how much real interest there is in this, maybe we should be looking at a more general spinning workshop. Perhaps a full day one with the weaving teachers we have available locally. Ginny will research options.

From the floor motion: Cinda proposed that we increase our donation to All Saint's Episcopal from \$250 to \$300 as a thank you for their generosity in providing us space for our meetings. We will move this at the June meeting.

The meeting ended at 3:00 pm.

Library Thing— How to access the Library Information:

Search the Guild website www.fiberartsguildlv.org : go to "LIBRARY", then click www.librarything.com

- 1. In the top brown bar, right side search box, type 'Vegas fiber arts' and enter.
- 2. Do not panic that it says 'no results' in the center section! Depending on your browser you will see the column on your left with "social" or a drop down menu labelled "works". Expand the drop down menu to find "social". Under Social you should find 'members' and a red or blue'1', click on either the word 'member' or the '1'. Now in the center section, find 'Vegas_Fiber_Arts" and click on it.
- On the left, you will see some logistics about our collection. The important line is the first one: "Collections Your Library" Click on 'Your library'

A list of all our books, DVD's etc comes up, usually with a snapshot of the cover in the left column. Or to find an author, specific book or subject, find the search function.

GETTING TO ALL SAINTS' EPISCOPAL CHURCH on 4201 West Washington Avenue, LV:

FROM SOUTH & EAST VALLEY: (Take I-15 North to) US 95 North, exit Valley View Blvd. and turn right. Turn left onto Washington Avenue when Valley View ends (about one quarter mile). All Saints' is about half a mile west on the left. FROM WEST & NORTH VALLEY: (Take Summerlin Parkway west to) US 95 South, exit Decatur Blvd. North (exit after Decatur South, watch the signs!). Go north about half a mile and turn right onto Washington Ave. All Saints' is about half a mile east on the right.

Whichever direction you come from, PAY ATTENTION ONCE YOU TURN ONTO WASHINGTON. The church is on the southeast corner of Washington and Glen Abby Court, but it's difficult to see until you're right next to it. PARKING is available on Glen Abbey Court street and in the parking lot including in back of the church. If you have a long vehicle, consider parking on the street as the lot is not very deep. Parking in the back is closest to the meeting rooms (Parish Hall). Enter the campus in front through the red gate and follow the signs to the Parish Hall (across the courtyard toward the right). The Guild logo will be also posted to show you where to go. If you park in the back, enter through the door with the Guild logo. **Doors open 8:45 am**.
