

This is a social event with colorful results - a DIY dye day!

If you accept this invitation, your <u>participation</u> is REQUIRED. There will be multiple Dye Stations set up, from immersion pots, tables for hand painting and crock-pots, to Shibori whatever you want to do! Remember, you can over dye anything. And, if you are clueless about dyeing......join the club. It's kind of learn as you go – ask questions – and above all, have fun!

Because of the preparation required, **YOU MUST RSVP**... (text or email) Bring a food item to share with the group. This can be anything you would normally bring to a picnic (or Banquet!)

Here is a list of dye supplies you can bring, and how to prepare fibers the day before:

- 1. Something to dye fiber, fabric, yarn, MORE DETAILS ON PAGE 4
- 2. crock pot *dedicated to dye*, if you have one (Thrift stores are a good source),
- 3. Plastic bags to bring wet things home and Gallon jug (or two) of vinegar
- 4. Soak your protein fiber evening before, optional, it saves time
- 5. Ice Dyeing: depending how much you want to dye, please bring 10-20 lb of cubed ice

NEW DYEING STUDY GROUP

Several members are interested in forming a dyeing study group with the goal of scientific accuracy to achieve formulas for reproduceable colors. There will be at least a couple of planning meetings this fall (dates tbd) and a projected start date in January. Members will likely work in pairs to produce a portion of the color wheel (numbers of colors tbd); every member will receive a complete set of colors and the formulas use to create them. We will start with fiber reactive dyes on cotton or Tencel. If there is interest, we may continue with acid dyes.


Everyone joining this study group MUST COMMIT TO SCIENTIFIC ACCURACY in all measurements and processes. (The random measuring we do at dye day is fun but not reproduceable.) All participants must own a scale accurate to .01 gram (yes, we will be using metric measurements). There will be a small, shared cost for lots of syringes (no needles), which are cheap on Amazon, for measuring milliliters.



We are also asking all the guild members to save 32-ounce plastic containers for us, the kind that sour cream and cottage cheese come in. The 32-ounce containers that yogurt comes in are harder to use (and we already have lots). Please bring them to any meeting.

Elements of this study group, including the schedule, are still being developed. If you are interested, please talk to Jami Johnson, Janet Mayers, or Cinda Towne.

SPECIFICS ON HOW TO PREPARE FIBERS

The evening before Dye Day soak your clean fiber/yarn/fabric in water (not hot!) When you get here, we will have tubs with the proper chemical dissolved in water for you to put your yarn/fiber/fabric in to soak for at least 30 minutes before you can dye.

Soaking at home is <u>NOT</u> required, but it saves time. This is for protein fibers. If you are dyeing fabric, prewash in hot water to remove sizing.

If you are going to dye something in a crock pot, you don't need to pre-soak. You will use 50/50 water and vinegar (we have enough vinegar!)

We will have tubs for Ice Dying but you have to **bring your own ice**. Depending on how much you'll be dyeing, you will need 10-20 lbs of cubed ice.

Setup is Friday October 10, the day before Dye Day, starting at 9 am. We NEED your help, even if it's just a few hours! Please send Ginny @ 805-236-9993) a text if you can come to help setup. There's lots to do and not all of it is lifting heavy objects! Thanks!!!

DUES

FIBER ARTS GUILD SKEIN EXCHANGE

Since we ran out of time at the September meeting, the deadline for the Skein Exchange has been **extended** to the **November meeting on Nov. 8**th.

Spin a 2-ply skein weighing a minimum of 4 ounces (about 114 g.) to be randomly exchanged with other participants.

- 1. Use any natural fiber of any color. Fiber may be dyed. No synthetics.
- 2. Spin and ply using your preferred method. Any weight of yarn is acceptable.
- 3. Be sure to wet finish your yarn. For more on wet finishing your spinning, see "Yarnitecture" by Jillian Moreno.
- 4. Submit your skein(s) with each skein tagged with your information: your name, fiber content and source (if known), drop spindle or spinning wheel used and speed whorl (if applicable), total weight, any other information you feel is relevant.
- 5. Bring to the November 2025 meeting.

Skeins will be placed in brown paper bags and distributed via random number drawing. If you select your own yarn, you can select another.
