

Rich called the meeting to order at 9:07 and welcomed members & guests. Our guests today were:

Diane Ricks - She does some of everything, sewing, painting and fiber arts. She was a member of a guild in So. Cal and has been to several national conferences.

Beth Little has done textiles with emphasis on painting or dyeing and is interested in learning with the group.

Approval of Minutes: Diane Smith moved the September minutes appearing in the November newsletter be accepted. The motion was seconded by Stephanie Bryant.

REPORTS:

Treasurer and Membership: Cinda reported that the Guild checking account currently has \$5,490.14. Dues for this year needed to be paid in order to be in the updated directory. She has not been able to pay Elizabeth Holdman for her presentation so far as Elizabeth needs to send in her W-9. Several requests have been made.

Committee Reports

Newsletter - Hermi thanks Janet and Meg for the many pictures for the recent newsletter from the various demos at events that the Guild has attended. She asked that members keep sending snippets and ideas for future newsletters.

Workshops - Meg & Janet report and discussion: Janet made a motion to the Workshop fees to \$65.00 maximum per day for all workshops. This was seconded by Diana. Members had a discussion, and the fee increase was passed. Non-members' price will be an additional \$15.00 per day. SAVE THE DATE - A workshop by Annie MacHale will be held on May 1-3, 2026. Material fees will be \$5.00, a one-time fee for the whole course. More details will be available at the January meeting. Enrollment will begin at that time. Contact Meg Harrington with any questions.

Programs - Maria reported that all the programs have been assigned for each meeting through June with some booked out for next fall as well.

Raffle - Ginny reported she has a large variety of raffle items and would like another table for display in our new space.

Historian - Elaine had no updates to report today.

Web and Social Media - Diana (Sue was not present) got Zoom up and running at our new location and she spoke about YouTube being an excellent resource for fiber artists.

Equipment and Library - Janet reminded members that the library is in her home, but we can check the website to see what books and materials are available for checkout. Current equipment for rent at \$35.00/month: 3 table looms and a Baby Wolf. Contact Janet if you are interested in any of the library items.

Study Groups and Continual Educational Demonstrations:

Spinning Circle/Band Group at Sahara West Library Wednesdays 10 am - Dani reported that this group is going strong! They had 18 spinners at one of the recent circles.

RH Study Group - 2nd Wednesday of each month - Janet indicated that the attendance at the RH group will take a hiatus and reconvene in January. Currently, members are concentrating on other disciplines.

Scientific Dye Study Group - Jami, Cinda & Janet are spearheading this and are working out details now. There was a sign-up sheet, and 9 members indicated they would like to be a part of the study Group. Measuring is critical and participants will get a complete ring of colors. Sessions will be after the first of the year, with times to be decided. For everyone in the guild: Please save any 32-ounce dairy containers! There will be a material fee, but it has not been finalized at this point.

New Business: Rich asked for a motion to shift the Annual Meeting from June to the May meeting. This was voted and approved. The motion was made by Rich and seconded by Diana.

Past Demos:

Farm Fest - Dani said it was lots of fun with a lovely lunch provided. The children enjoyed spindle spinning at our booth.

Upcoming Demos:

Cactus Joe's "Stewards of the Earth" will be November 15 & 16. Hermi has 4 members signed up for the morning of the 15th and 3 members in the afternoon. Two are signed up for the 16th.

Next Meeting is December 13, 2025. It is the Holiday Potluck and Gift Auction, at Jami's house.

Adjourn: There being no other business, the meeting was ended at 9:40. Refreshments, a Zoom presentation by Alanna Wilcox, "How to Approach Creativity" (A copy of her presentation will be made available.), Show and Tell, and Handspun Skein Exchange with only 3 participants in the skein exchange and the Raffle followed.


Details about the Holiday Party at Jami's


