We shoot NRA 4-position (prone, sitting, kneeling, standing) with some accommodations for disabilities. We compete 9 weeks with a 10th week for tie breakers and makeups. This is a handicap league, so shooters of all abilities are welcome. We gather around 6:00 PM with shooting at 6:30 PM.

The election for club officers and directors will be held during the December general meeting. We will have the final call for candidates at that time. You are encouraged to come to the meeting to get your name on the ballot or to vote.

CARETAKERS REPORT

We recently had a mishap with our tractor. While loading wood chips from behind the action bays, we go too close to the edge of the pit and managed to put the tractor on its side. Fortunately, there were no injuries. We had the tractor hauled off to Jennings for repairs.

PAUL BUNYAN AND BLACK POWDER

Black powder can be a dangerous powder to use, especially if you're not trained and experienced with its capabilities. If you ignite a small pile of modern smokeless powder, it will light and burn. However, if you ignite black powder it will explode. <u>Smokeless powder is</u> a propellant, but <u>black powder is an</u> explosive. Muzzleloaders can only shoot black powder or black powder synthetic substitutes. You cannot use modern smokeless powder in a gun designed to use black powder, because the pressure from the modern smokeless powder is dangerously greater than black powder or black powder or black powder.

Paul Bunyan has a rule, as do most ranges, when loading a black powder gun, loading **cannot** be done with a powder horn, powder flask, powder can, or anything other than a **powder measure**. A powder measure holds the amount of powder for one load. Muzzleloaders, when fired, can retain hot embers from the last shot burning in the breech and when new powder is introduced into the gun, it explodes.

The rule about not pouring powder directly from a powder horn, flask, or can, becomes selfexplanatory if one asks the question, "Would you rather have 70 grains of black powder discharging in your face or a whole pound (7000 grains) of black powder blowing up next to your head?" The obvious answer is, "Neither." When shooting with and handling black powder, it is paramount that the utmost care be given to its use.

At all times while shooting any firearm, we must pay attention to the report of the shot or the lack thereof. That's in the realm of a misfire, hang-fire, squib-load, or cook-off:

<u>**Misfire 1**</u> – This is when you pull the trigger and there's a click and no boom.

<u>Misfire 2</u> – This is when the primer goes pop, but the powder does not go boom.

<u>Hang-Fire</u> – This is when you pull the trigger and there's a delay in the boom.

<u>Squib-Load</u> – This is when you pull the trigger and the boom is only a poof. That means either

the primer was defective, the load was under charged, or the powder was bad.

<u>**Cook-Off**</u> – This is when your gun is so hot, the next round discharges on its own.

In all cases whether shooting a muzzleloader or modern firearm, follow these steps:

- Maintain control of the gun, keeping it pointed down range in a safe direction.
- For a **modern firearm**, point down range for 30 seconds to 1 minute, then unload.
- For a **muzzleloader**, point the gun down range for 1-2 minutes, then recap and try to refire. If the second attempt to fire is not successful, wait 1 minute and unload.

Shooting is fun when we follow all the safety rules. However, if someone mishandles black powder or a firearm, the consequences can affect all of us. **As Always – Stay Safe**.

2025 WINTER PISTOL LEAGUE

The Paul Bunyan 2025 Winter Pistol League begins January 23 and continues on Thursday evenings through March 27. This is a .22 rimfire pistol league, however an "any gun" class will be provided for those wishing to use a centerfire pistol instead. New shooters are welcome, and there will be an "open" class where firing using a 2-hand grip is allowed. If there is enough interest, a revolver and/or iron sight category can be added. This league will not be NRA registered.

There will be 10 weeks to fire 8 record scores and you may shoot ahead or make up by shooting both relays. You may fire up to 10 record scores, and the best 8 will be used for aggregate score, standings and awards. The course of fire will be 20 rounds Slow Fire, 20 rounds Timed Fire and 20 rounds Rapid Fire all fired at 25 yards. The first relay will begin at 5:00 PM and the second relay at 6:15 PM (arrive not less than 15 minutes early to get set up).

At the end of the league there will be cash awards to class winners, and a prize drawing for all participants. Entry fee will be \$25.

ROUND BALLS AND LONG SHOTS

What better way to challenge yourself than to shoot round balls for long distances. That was the theme of the match this month for the Paul Bunyan Plainsmen. Bil Sick thought this one up, but we can be thankful he had us shooting from the bench. We also had the benefit of a good day with good light.

After Helen Sick got everyone registered, Bill explained the course of The first target was a bullseve fire. buffalo at 75 yards, with each of the 5 shots scoring as the scoring rings showed. After this volley, we reset the target frames with the Squirrel, with another 5 shots, five points each for a body shot and 10 points if you hit the bullseye. Next up was five shots at a 15" gong at 100 yards, with each hit counting for 5 points. And finally he had some playing cards stapled to the new hawk blocks and you had five chances to cut a card with your tomahawk, earning five points per cut. For this devilry we were shooting supported from the bench, with spotting scopes for assistance. If you do the math, that means that there

is a total possible score of 150 (50 each for the paper targets and 25 each for the gongs and hawks).
