Governor Inslee signed three anti-gun bills last month. The three bills, an “extended” magazine ban, Senate Bill 5078, a “Ghost Gun” ban, House Bill 1705, and a bill placing additional restrictions on where we can carry firearms- House Bill 1630, were signed into law by the Governor. To add some variety, Jack had two steel gongs as part of the course of fire, with the whiskey jug hanging at 30 ft and


