ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL (ASI) ACTIVITIES

Our regularly set first Saturday of the month match was rescheduled for Sunday – July 24th due to calendar conflicts. We followed our shooting sport cousin IDPA's Saturday match. Back-to-Back matches on a weekend can be iffy. Most times folks shoot one day or choose the other, as such attendance can be split. So, what a pleasant delight to have 52 attendees – 16 of which attended New Shooter Orientation! A club high!

This match featured 6 sun-drenched stages in the action pistol bays, which included a new "Taco Hell" stage where the shooter engages 7 targets and 2 steel after being accosted in a fast – food restaurant. The other – a long time crowd favorite requires getting a '6-pack' from the start position to its final rest in a shopping cart. There were many creative solutions to accomplishing

this goal while engaging targets from in the open or behind cover.

The match had a variety of levels of attendees. For some it was their very first experience of moving and shooting. Others compete in USPSA or IDPA and were seizing the opportunity for next Saturday's Hand-sized Handgun match at Renton Fish & Game, and others were in the area after shooting USPSA's State match.

For the new shooter having to option to use a gun case to ferry the weapon stage to stage, made this sport accessible. Not having a holster – didn't have to mean being excluded from ASI matches. In fact, it does contribute to greater participation. We had 8 gals participate – most from our own Ladies Shooting League.

Our next match is Saturday, August 6th. New Shooter Orientation (NSO) is mandatory prior to the match. NSO is at 9 am – day of match – in Bay 1. Bring your gear and sit back for the 30 min presentation hosted by ASI's own Match Director Joey Russo.

Pre-registration on [PracticeScore](#) is appreciated – search for our matches under the tab Matches and ASI at Paul Bunyan for the list of upcoming ones.

Membership in the range is not a requirement – but safe gun handling skills, a .22 to .45 caliber handgun or PCC, at least 2 boxes of ammo (most stages are a shy 100 rounds with no make-up shots), eye and ear protection, is.

Our first fall match is October 1st – where we will once again host The Senior Classic – a match celebrating those 50 and older (but Gen X'ers and younger can certainly join us). Stay tuned for more details later in August.
