IN THE NEWS

The Tacoma City Council voted in a new gun and ammunition law that will go into effect starting July 1, 2020. The proposal, modeled after a similar law passed in Seattle a couple of years ago, calls for a \$25 tax on retail firearms, a 2-cent tax per round of ammunition that is .22 caliber or less and a 5-cent tax for larger ammunition. There are petitions being circulated for Initiative I-1094, which would repeal the recently passed I-1639, and make changes to I-594. We have the petitions on the rifle range for those wishing to sign the petition and get it on the ballot. More information on the initiative can be found here.
