The course of fire consisted of three paper targets, three gongs, and a pumpkin. For the paper targets, there were 5 shots each on the standing bear, the turkey, and the turkey running from the pilgrim. That pilgrim target is a tough one because if you hit the pilgrim, it's a 10-point deducted from your score. The gongs consisted of a turkey, a chicken, and a chick, with one change each for a score of 10 per hit. And the pumpkin, if one could call it that, was slightly smaller than a baseball and was hanging from a string. That was one shot for 10 points as well. All targets were shot at 25 yards.

As a bit of an incentive, extra credit was given for period dress. There were 3 points given for 3 articles of clothing, or 5 points given for a "head to toe" outfit. The Plainsmen are trying to encourage everyone to stay focused on the historical aspect of our shooting and to help get folks ready for rendezvous. So, if you're counting, that a total possible score of 195 points.

The shooting was fun, and no one could complain about the weather. They could, of course, complain about how small that pumpkin looked, how the pilgrim is awfully close to the turkey, how finicky some of those guns can be, or how when you have a big ball hitting a little metal target, it can bounce right off its stand. And we won't even mention the dang tractor not wanting to start once it was downrange during setup. But a good time was had by all.

Next month is our Toys 4 Tots Christmas shoot, which will be one week early on December 19<sup>th</sup>. In lieu of a shooter's fee we will be asking for donations, either cash or new, unwrapped toys. The muzzleloading community usually comes up with \$1800 to \$2000, which supports an amazing program. Let's help the kids out again this year.

#### **2022 WINTER PISTOL LEAGUE**

The 2022 Winter Pistol League will begin January 20 and continue on Thursday evenings through March 24. This is a .22 rimfire pistol league, however an "any gun" class will be provided for those wishing to use a centerfire pistol instead. New shooters are welcome, and there will be an "open" class where firing using a 2-hand grip is allowed. If there is enough interest, a revolver and/or iron sight category can be added. This league will not be NRA registered.

There will be 10 weeks to fire 8 record scores and you may shoot ahead or make up by shooting both relays. The course of fire will be 20 rounds Slow Fire, 20 rounds Timed Fire and 20 rounds Rapid Fire all fired at 25 yards. The first relay will begin at 5:00 PM and the second relay at 6:15 PM (arrive not less than 15 minutes early to get set up).

At the end of the league there will be cash awards to class winners, and a prize drawing for all participants. Entry fee will be \$25.
