JANUARY MEETING NOTES

The club officers and directors for 2020 were sworn into office at the meeting. The new directors are Jim Steward and Marty Kotzke. Jim Steward gathered the most votes for director, so he will serve a 2-year term. The remainder of the board remains the same as last year.

A proposal was made at the general meeting to amend Article VIII of the club constitution. The proposed addition would read as follows:

Article VII (D) Secretary, Membership:

He/She shall maintain the membership information of the club. That information will be the sole property of the Board of Directors. The use of that information will be at the sole discretion of the board of directors.

A voice vote was taken at the meeting to allow this amendment to go forward. A membership vote to approve this addition will be taken at the February 28th general meeting.

Director Kevin Olson reports that several firearms related bills are working their way thru or have been passed by the state legislature. These bills will have a serious impact on all gun owners. Information on these bills can be found on the GOAL website and on the NRA-ILA website.

The club has purchased an automated external defibrillator (AED) machine for use around the range. This is one of those things we have purchased with the hopes of never having to use it. It will be mounted near the range officer's shack on the rifle range. The machine comes with instructions that are easy to follow. A quick course on how to use one like it can be found here.

SHOT SHOW 2020 REVIEW

Shot Show is the Firearms Industry largest trade show in the United States – originally introduced 40 years ago as the Shooting, Hunting and Outdoor Trade show. Admittance is restricted to commercial buyers and sellers of military, tactical and law enforcement and related services only. It is not open to the public. This five day event is crammed into 3 floors of the Sands Convention Center covering 14 miles of aisles and exhibits...not including casinos! There are over 65,000 visitors expected to attend over the 5 day event. It is exhausting and exhilarating to be a part of this event.

Both Joey (ASI – MD) and I (Ladies Shooting League) were able to preview an amazing array of weaponry and accessories. Personally – I'm not a technical shooter...I know what I like and I like what's familiar – so visiting the vendor booths of Glock and Walther were the hi-lights. VISION X SPONSORED YEAR END CHARITY EVENT DOUBLES PROCEEDS

The 4th Annual Vision X Night Match Classic, held at the Paul Bunyan Rifle and Sportsman's Club, raised over \$20,000 for the U.S. Marine Corps Reserves Toys for Tots Foundation. The proceeds were double the amount from last year's competition, which raised \$10,705 in 2018. The Vision X Night Match is an outlaw UML scoring format shooting competition. This year featured Pistol/Pistol Caliber Carbine (PCC) divisions, which spanned three days with six-night stages and six-day stages, with a total of twelve stages.

With spectators and competitors, this has been the largest Vision X Night Match Classic yet, featuring a wide range of competitors from firsttime shooters to experienced veterans. "We had overwhelming support from sponsors, staff, and competitors, which drove this donation to its highest yet," said Tim Novasky, Match Director. There were 43 sponsors this year with 147 competitors, 51 more competitors than last year. "Throughout the weekend I had people nonstop coming up to me, telling me how much fun they were having, and thanking me for being part of the staff that put the event on. The match would have never been this big without our sponsors, our vendors, and the shooters. Everyone really fit together like the pieces of a puzzle to make this event a success."

Special Announcement: the ASI February 1st match is a Fundraiser for PCSO Deputy Connor Dyson, who was killed just before Christmas in a patrol car crash. He leaves behind a wife, a toddler and an infant. Deputy Dyson died prior to vesting in the State's LEOFF 2 retirement system. His survivors will receive no pension. Proceeds of this match will be donated to Pierce County Sheriff's Legacy Fund established for them.
