JANUARY MEETING NOTES

Once again, the general meeting was cancelled due to the COVID-19 restrictions. We did hold a combination on-site/virtual board of directors meeting. We will start holding general meetings when the restrictions have eased a bit.

Due to the COVID restrictions, our hunter education classes have been cancelled until further notice. Watch the BullSheet for information on when the classes will resume. Contact Marty Kotzke if you have any questions.

Darrell Behounek reports that he sold \$208 worth of brass last month. Income from the sales goes to support the Junior Club.

Marty Kotzke has had a few folks join him recently on the shotgun range. He opens the trap house on the first Wednesday evening and the third Sunday morning of the month (see calendar). The cost is \$6/25 birds from the trap house. We also have a manual thrower for those who want to do a little practice with a friend. Bring your clay birds and have at it.

Club member John Schauf has designed a lighter target frame for use on the rifle and pistol ranges to replace the heavy frames now in use. John's prototype was constructed using 2x2's for the uprights and feet instead of the 2x4's that are currently being used, and is assembled using screws so individual wood parts are easier to replace. John is going to build a few of the frames for us to try. If they hold up to the range use, more will be built in 2' and 4' wide sizes.

We once again have a waiting list to get a membership to our club. With all of the recent COVID restrictions, we have had to restrict the attendance at our orientation meetings, causing a huge back-up of applicants. At this time, we are taking reservations for the July orientation (February thru June are already booked up). Our club must be a popular place to shoot!

CLUB ELECTION RESULTS

We have elected a new club President and two new directors for 2021. Tessina Hurley, a long-time club member and avid USPSA shooter was elected as our new President replacing Rocky Walston who is in the process of moving to Eastern Washington. Tessina is the first female president in the history of our club. We will also have two new directors for this year. Long time club member and range volunteer Ken Swasey was voted in along with range officer and hunter sight-in chairman Mark Voigt. Incumbent director Marty Kotzke garnered the most votes, so he will be serving a two-year term. PASSING

We received the sad news that Lifetime club member Bob Koehler passed away in December at his home in Las Vegas. Bob was born on May 18, 1935, in Worcester, MA. He enlisted in the Navy in 1953, proudly serving his country for over 20 years. He was a Vietnam vet and was a proud member of the "Brown Water Navy" team that patrolled the rivers of Vietnam. Bob retired from the Navy in 1973 as a Chief Petty Officer, and started a second career in office machine repair and sales. He was an avid outdoorsman, and also enjoyed traveling and woodworking. Bob was a well-respected stalwart member of our club for many years, serving as a board member and match director, and helping our club in many other capacities. Bob is survived by his wife Jean, four daughters, six grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

DUES AND INITIATION FEE INCREASES

After much discussion at previous board meetings, the board voted at the November meeting to increase the annual membership dues and the one-time new member initiation fees. For the past few years, the club has operated in the red. With prices of everything going up and the impact of the COVID restrictions on the range, the board felt it necessary to increase our fees, something we haven't done in many years.

Effective September 1, 2021, the annual membership dues will be increased to \$120. Existing 2020 members who have not yet renewed for 2021 will have the option of extending their membership, for up to 3 years, at the old \$96/year rate if the renewal is received by April 30, 2021. Those who have already renewed for 2021 will have the option to renew for up to 2 additional years at the existing rate if the renewal is received by April 30, 2021.

Effective as of January 2021, the one-time initiation fee for new members will increase to \$150 and the annual dues for new members will be \$120.

MEMBERSHIP

With the COVID restrictions, we had to postpone the December orientation until January. We held three smaller meetings this month so we could keep everyone socially distanced. USE OF THE RED COLD RANGE INDICATOR LIGHTS

We have had several complaints of individuals using the red "cold range indicator" lights in an unsafe manner. Some shooters have been observed flipping on the red light switches and proceeding downrange without communicating with the other shooters to confirm a cold range. This is happening when we have no RSO on duty, creating an unsafe condition for all on the range. The red lights are not to be used to call for a cold range. They are only an indication that someone is down range and that the range is operating under cold conditions. If you observe an occurrence of this, please discuss it with the member or report it to a club officer (names are on the RSO shack). During those times when there is no RSO on duty, all members using the range are de-facto range officers and must help keep the range operating in a safe manner.

To call for a cold range, you must clear and ground your firearms and communicate with **all** others on the firing line that you would like to call for a cold range, step behind the yellow (red on the pistol range) line and ensure that the line is in fact safe. Then, and only then, should **all** persons proceeding downrange turn on the switch nearest to their firing position. When you return to a safe position behind the firing line, turn off the same switch. Once **all** of the red-light switches are turned off and the red lights quit blinking, shooters must communicate verbally and visually with all others on the firing line to make sure everyone is in agreement and knows that the range is once again hot.

CARETAKER'S REPORT

We had 12 trees come down in the last big wind storm. Many of them had root rot, so they just topple over, roots and all. One was found to be full of ants that had eaten away at the center of the tree. We have pulled most of the logs out so they can be sold as firewood (\$50 for a pickup truck load). All of the trails through the property are now clear. One of the trees came down over the east perimeter fence, so we have contacted a fencing company to do the necessary repairs.
