DECEMBER MEETING NOTES

Once again, the general meeting was cancelled due to the COVID-19 restrictions. We did hold a combination on-site/virtual board of directors meeting.

Dave Farrow reports that the 5th annual Vision-X matches were a huge success for the Toys-for-Tots program again this year. The sponsors: Targets USA, R&R Targets, SeaTac Electric, Esstac, NWSafe, Elftmann Tactical, Springer Precision, Run and Gun Apparel, Minuteman Coffee, Armed Concepts, 2A Kids, 3D Stage Builder, Range Panda Products, AMG Lab Timer, Gray Guns, Aero Precision and Rainer Arms all stepped up big time this year. The match donated a total of \$27,500 plus toys for the Toys-for-Tots program. Our IDPA match was able to donate another \$1050 plus a table full of toys, plus the muzzleloaders donated \$1705 plus toys. All totaled, the club donated over \$30,215 plus a truckload of toys to help over 8000 families in need this year.

Darrell Behounek reports that he sold \$172 in brass, Doug Shellenberger sold another \$160, and Dave Farrow sold another \$681 just this month. All brass sale proceeds go toward the junior program.

Marty Kotzke has the big trap house on the shotgun range open on the first Wednesday evening and the third Sunday morning of each month. The cost is \$6 for a round of 25 birds.

The informal airgun league continues on alternating Wednesday evenings. We have a few guns to loan for new shooters while shooting and a chronograph available if you need to test your gun for compliance. If you have any questions, contact us [here](#).

DUES AND INITIATION FEE INCREASES

After much discussion at the past few board meetings, the board voted at the November meeting to increase the annual membership dues and the one-time new member initiation fees. For the past few years, the club has operated in the red. With prices of everything going up and the impact of the COVID restrictions on the range, the board felt it necessary to increase our fees.

Effective September 1, 2021, the annual membership dues will be increased to \$120. Existing members who have not yet renewed for 2021 will have the option of extending their membership, for up to 3 years, at the old \$96/year rate if the renewal is received by April 30, 2021. Those who have already renewed for 2021 will have the option to renew for up to 2 additional years at the existing rate if the renewal is received by April 30, 2021.

Effective January 2021, the one-time initiation fee for new members will increase to \$150 and the annual dues for new members will be \$120.

It was a fabulous 2020 for ASI at Paul Bunyan. Despite not having range access due to COVID for a few select months, we enjoyed a growing support for this “Move and Shoot Sport for Everyone”. Since its debut at Paul Bunyan in July, 2019 – we had held 8 matches, with an average of 43 shooters including 9 women.

We held a fundraiser for Fallen Pierce County Deputy Connor Dyson in February, which included a drawing for 2 pistols. Additionally, we had a specialty match for beloved, and rarely shot, “Safe Queens” for a low round count match. Standby for in 2021, we are planning a “One Hand Only Match” – clever-title-yet-to-be-discovered where all stages are shot Strong Hand or Support Hand.

Interested in a future ASI Match? For most of 2021, ASI will be on the 1st Saturday of the month. Due to a few scheduling conflicts, there are a few adjustments, so be sure to double-check Paul Bunyan’s website’s on-line calendar. Also, on www.practicescore.com, under ASI at Paul Bunyan, where we require pre-registration for now. Due to COVID restrictions we do offer a limited number of slots available for new shooters. With ASI’s limited requirement for ammo – averaging less than a 100 rounds a match;

equipment - .22 to .45 handgun, no holster or mag pouches necessary, just a case or gun sleeve to transport your unloaded weapon from stage to stage and a handy pocket for placing reloads – you are ready to go.

Ladies Shooting League's 2020 Year-in-Review

2020 was a busy year for The League. Despite COVID restrictions we were able to meet via Zoom during the shutdown, and when things opened up the pistol bays were available and we continued to meet for events, to include The Balloon Races, fun training targets and social distancing socialization.

In August and October – The League had representation at three major IDPA (International Defensive Pistol Association) Championships. At Washington State's and in Mississippi's "The Southern Belle" – an all-women's IDPA Championship and IDPA's Postal Match. Reviews on these matches are in the Bullsheat's September, and October issues, respectively.

Other local matches some of our ladies competed in were the Handsized-Handgun 'World' Championship hosted by Renton Fish & Game's ASI Club and Movember Charity match – also hosted by Renton Fish & Game.

The League continues to sponsor Paul Bunyan's ASI (Action Shooting International) chapter. ASI is a "Shoot and Move Sport for Everyone." On average – one can find 3 – 7 members participating in a match. If there's an interest in ASI – be sure to ask anyone of us about how to get started.

Pistol competition is just a fraction of what The League participates in; primarily we host twice monthly meetings. The first Wednesday and the third Sunday of each month. Wednesday nights are labelled "Girlz Nite Out" starting at 6 pm. Sunday is "T(rigger)-Time which begins at 11 am. You will find us in the pistol bays.

In 2019, we introduced the Pew-Pew Challenge! Gals who 'freed' 1200 Pews (aka. Bullets) for the year received a gift. In 2020, we distributed more than 25 custom morale patches to those who turned in their tally sheets. 1st and 2nd place 'Freerers' of Pews received additional recognition. We have continued this program for an additional year. 2021 Pew-Pew Tracking sheets will be distributed beginning at our January meeting.

Our Toys 4 Tots Drive netted a lovely collection of toys and cash this December. Paul Bunyan's combined energies annually provides 100s of toys and thousands of dollars for this

worthy charity collected in November and December.

Since 2015, The Ladies League has been a steady fixture at Paul Bunyan, meeting twice a month in the covered and heated pistol bays next to the rifle range. Christa Beasley has lead and inspired our League those years. We have over 100 members and generally have 8 – 15 women attend any given event. Best of all, one doesn't need to be a member of the range or the League to attend. So, bring a friend and come out to the range and see what it's like. Don't forget to bring eye and ear protection, it's a requirement.

We invite all gals who have safe gun handling skills, who are interested in practicing their handgun skills in a warm and welcoming environment. Each event we provide custom fun training targets and social interaction. We have lady range mentors who enjoy sharing knowledge, firearms skills and answering questions.
