As we welcome the gray, cold and rain-ish ...okay RAIN – sleet -&/or snow weather to our range for the upcoming inclement months several questions have been posed: "Will the match be cancelled due to weather?" Towit the reply is a simple image: (see below).



No fair- weather pistol shooter – there is no rain delay or other interruptions for poor weather. We soldier on with plastic bags covering the targets, rain coats and tactical umbrellas covering us. One caveat, should a match be cancelled – we take great pains by sending out notifications via PracticeScore, another reason to pre-register or we would have the Paul Bunyan websites' calendar to reflect the change, with enough lead time.

For those who are considering the move to a shoot-and-move sport, ASI is ideal! Our range officers are committed to making your initial experience a positive one. Mentoring and patience is a key skill promoted for those in the position. When you decide to take the challenge – be sure to arrive early enough prior to the match to attend the mandatory New Shooter Orientation (NSO) at 9 am in Bay 1. We will squad you with seasoned shooters so there are others to help familiarize you with the ASI match.

Bring at least 100 rounds, your pistol (.22 - .45) and gun rug, case or holster and at least 1 reloading device. Pre-register on Practicescore, find us under Matches and search under: ASI at Paul Bunyan. Our matches are the first Saturday of the month. You can also find our match days on the website's on-line calendar.

2022 WINTER PISTOL LEAGUE

The 2022 Winter Pistol League will begin January 20 and continue on Thursday evenings through March 24. This is a .22 rimfire pistol league, however an "any gun" class will be provided for those wishing to use a centerfire pistol instead. New shooters are welcome, and there will be an "open" class where firing using a 2-hand grip is allowed. If there is enough interest, a revolver and/or iron sight category can be added. This league will <u>not</u> be NRA registered.

There will be 10 weeks to fire 8 record scores and you may shoot ahead or make up by shooting both relays. The course of fire will be 20 rounds Slow Fire, 20 rounds Timed Fire and 20 rounds Rapid Fire all fired at 25 yards. The first relay will begin at 5:00 PM and the second relay at 6:15 PM (arrive not less than 15 minutes early to get set up).

At the end of the league there will be cash awards to class winners, and a prize drawing for all participants. Entry fee will be \$25.
