JUNE MEETING NOTES

We will soon be replacing the range rules signage on all ranges. The new signs will reflect the updated rules adopted at the BOD meeting in April. The complete updated rules can be found on our website under the range rules tab.

The caretakers found the timbers in front of the 50-yard pistol berm are getting shot up pretty badly. We will soon front them with railroad ties or something similar.

A motion was made and passed at the board meeting to increase the annual hunter sight-in fees from \$6 per rifle to \$10, including tax, per rifle. We have found that most of the ranges in the area are charging \$10 and up to \$20 for their event. The hunter sight-in program starts in early September and runs thru mid-October and is a big money maker for our club, one of the things that are done by club volunteers to help keep our annual dues low. If you a few hours to spare, we could sure use your help. Volunteers are asked to help the hunter's sight-in their rifles, change and patch targets, place and retrieve the target holders, and a few miscellaneous duties. ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL (ASI)

On the 28th, we will be hosting the first [ASI](#) match for our club. ASI is an informal type of competition geared to the average gun owner, teaching gun skills in a fun atmosphere with the handguns they typically already own. It is a move and shoot type sport but no holster is required. All starts are from low-ready or table. (if you want to draw, you may do so with RSO permission). Firearms are transported from stage to stage in a gun case, range bag, or in a holster. Most matches have 5 to 7 stages. Round count is about 100, but bring more in case of a re-shoot. We accept handgun calibers .22 rimfire and larger. Bring two magazines or speed loaders as most stages have a reload required. Typically, matches last 2 to 4 hours depending on the number of participants. We have a regular squad of women who welcome new gals to ASI, and those with mobility issues may shoot standing without a penalty.

Early pre-registration and squadding is available at [Practicesscore](#) for the match. New shooters will be allocated to squads on the day of the match so they will be teamed with experienced ASI members.

Match fee is \$20. New shooter orientation is at 9:15am and is required for new ASI shooters. Registration opens at 9am and closes at 9:45am. Shooter's briefing is at 10am. ASI membership is required after your 2nd match. (Yes – we keep count!). At this time, we have matches scheduled for July 28th, August 25th, October 5th and December 7th.

SILHOUETTE MATCHES

On the first Saturday of the month, our range holds a silhouette shoot on the rifle range. The match consists of shooting steel plates, cutout to look like chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams, at ranges from 25 yards up to 200 meters. There is a category for almost any gun someone might have, from an open sight 22 handguns all the way to a scoped single shot hand cannons.

The cost of the match is \$7 (\$8 for big bore), and all shooters donate a few dollars to pay the target setters. The shooters have 2 minutes to shoot 5 silhouettes left to right. Any of the plates knocked over count as a hit. Those missed, shot out of turn, or hit and not knocked over count as a miss.
