MAY MEETING NOTES

The summer smallbore rifle league starts Monday June 3rd with a practice session and the competition starting on the 10th. The season continues for 9 weeks with one week for make-up matches. Sign in starts at 6pm with the match starting at 6:30pm, and finishing up around 8:30pm. Shooters have the option of shooting all prone at 50 and 100 yards or 3 position at 50 yards. For those who don't have their own rifle, the club has some to loan for use in the match. If you have questions, contact Bob Wendt.

We now have a new soda machine. Located on the patio on the north side of the clubhouse, it is stocked with various 20 oz soft drinks and water, priced at \$1 to \$1.50.

We are in the process of updating the club website. We are transitioning to a new platform with a few new features and a bit of a different look. We will still have the same content and functionality of the old website. The site should be up and running in a few weeks.

We will soon be replacing the range rules signage on all ranges. The new signs will reflect the updated rules adopted at the BOD meeting in April. The complete updated rules can be found on our website under the range rules tab.

On Saturday June 15th, Bob Wendt will host a 600-yard CMP practice shoot. This is an opportunity for those of us who would like to try our hand at 600-yard shooting. There will be 3-half hour sessions to shoot most any gun and as many rounds as the shooter would like. Shooters will alternate between shooting and working in the pits scoring, replacing and repairing targets. The cost for the shoot is \$5 to cover the cost of the targets. Sign-in is at 8am, with the shooting starting at 9am. Get in touch with Bob Wendt or Dennis Wilcox if you have any questions.

ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL (ASI)

On July 28th, we will be hosting the first [ASI](#) match for our club. ASI is an informal type of competition geared to the average gun owner, teaching gun skills in a fun atmosphere with the handguns they typically already own. It is a move and shoot type sport but no holster is required. All starts are from low-ready or table. (if you want to draw, you may do so with RSO permission). Firearms are transported from stage to stage in a gun case, range bag, or in a holster. Most matches have 5 to 7 stages. Round count is about 100, but bring more in case of a re-shoot. We accept handgun calibers .22 rimfire and larger. Bring two magazines or speed loaders as most stages have a reload required. Typically, matches last 2 to 4 hours depending on the number of participants. We have a regular squad of women who welcome new gals to ASI, and those with mobility issues may shoot standing without a penalty. (cont'd)

Early pre-registration and squadding is available at [Practicescore](#) for the match. New shooters will be allocated to squads on the day of the match so they will be teamed with experienced ASI members.

Match fee is \$20. New shooter orientation is at 9:15am and is required for new ASI shooters. Registration opens at 9am and closes at 9:45am. Shooter's briefing is at 10am. ASI membership is required after your 2nd match. (Yes – we keep count!). At this time, we have matches scheduled for July 28th, August 25th, October 5th and December 7th.
