## **RANGE GUEST POLICY**

It has always been a standing club rule that a member may occasionally have a limited number of guests with him at the range and the member is responsible for the supervision of those guests. During the past two board meetings, we have been discussing the number of guests a member is allowed to bring to the range per visit. This issue has come up often through the years and the board felt the time was long overdue to clarify and update our guest policy. Going forward, members are limited to bringing no more than two guests to the range per visit. If a member wants to bring in more than two guests, arrangements must be made through the Chief Range Safety Officer or the board of directors.

Guests are the responsibility of the member and must be supervised by the member at all times while at the range. Proper supervision may preclude the member from shooting.

It was also noted that some members are abusing the “occasionally” portion of this standing rule. If you have the same guest more than a few times a year, then he/she should become a member.

The club policy forbidding the commercial training (firearm training by individuals or companies other than Paul Bunyan) at the range stays in effect.

# ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL (ASI)

Our May match was held on a Sunday due to scheduling conflicts. But nevertheless, we still welcomed 50 shooters – to include 5 new ones to our sport. This match hosted 5 ASI stages and 1 Bonus Stage – where the new USPSA structure in Bay 6, was incorporated. This 8-round stage, embodied the rules of ASI – but we added a whimsical note. The Bonus Stage is well received and we plan on offering up one each match.

We have had several inquiries as to what a typical ASI match is like. Most shooters should arrive between 8:45 and 9: 45 to squad and pay fee. New Shooter Orientation (NSO) is at 9 am in Bay 1. You are considered new if you haven't shot ASI at Paul Bunyan before – or at Renton Fish & Game. NSO is an opportunity to learn both the range rules of Paul Bunyan and ASI rules. An added bonus of NSO is enjoying Rangemaster Russo's presentation. Well worth the price of admission!

10 am is Shooter's Briefing. When complete, squads go to their designated Bay for stage briefing. Each squad has 2 Range Officers (RO). It is typical for us to have 6 – 7 stages a match. When the squad has completed its final stage – break down of the stage needs to be done. A 6-stage match is usually complete before 1 pm.

Summer scheduling conflicts has us moving from our usual 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of the month. This is what our calendar looks like currently: July 25 (Sunday); August 22<sup>nd</sup> (Sunday); No September Match. As always, check the calendar of Paul Bunyan's website to confirm.
