LEGISLATURE REPORT

Georgia has become the 25th state in the union to adopt *Constitutional Carry*, whereby a law-abiding citizen is free to carry a firearm without obtaining a state issued license. It joins Alabama, Ohio, and Indiana in enacting similar laws just this year.

Before you decide to "pack heat" on your summer vacation this year, be aware that many of these laws are more complex in nature than simply "shall not be infringed", and may not extend the benefit to that state's non-resident visitors. Mike Moran picked the course of fire. To start with there were two paper targets which were both shot at 25 yards, a bullseye target for 10 shots and a rabbit for 5 shots. The scores were taken from the scoring rings on each target. Next there were two steel gongs, a rabbit and a duck, placed at 40 yards with one shot at each for 10 points per hit. To round things off, at 15 yards were hung the world's best targets and worst tasting candy, PEEPS! There were two shots at the Peeps with 10 points per hit. This would give you a possible 190 points, but we also gave extra credit for primitive dress -3points for three articles of clothing, or 5 points for a full outfit.



Eric Burkhead was on hand to take the \$10 shooting fee during registration, and the shooter's safety meeting got started right at 9:30 am, where Mike went over the course of fire. It almost felt wrong shooting in such nice conditions. Frank Haggard and Dan Albro were back for their second shoot with us, along with Nick Snowden who watched in March but shot with us today. Other than one shooter having to pull a ball, the match went flawlessly. Afterward the scores were tallied and prizes given out.

NRA BASICS OF PERSONAL PROTECTION IN THE HOME COURSE

The NRA Basics of Personal Protection in the Home Course is taught by NRA Certified Instructors and will cover the basics of defensive shooting with a handgun. Participants will learn about basic defensive handgun skills, firearms and the law, strategies for home safety, selection of a handgun for self-defense, and more. This course consists of two mandatory sessions: June 25 and 26, 9 AM - 3 PM both days. Advance registration and deposit of course fee (\$75) are required. Membership in Paul Bunyan R&S Club and/or the NRA is not required in order to attend this course. Follow the <u>link</u> below to begin registration for the course.

COURSE PREREQUISITES

Completion of NRA Basic Pistol Course, or equivalent experience. Successful completion of the PPITH pre-course evaluation (see below). All participants must be eligible to possess firearms in compliance with applicable Federal and State Law. Pregnant Women and nursing Mothers Pregnant women and nursing mothers are encouraged to discuss their participation in this course with their physicians prior to attending. They should discuss the effects of exposure to loud sounds and airborne lead particulate.

PPITH COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Length: Total Class and range time is ten hours (may run longer, depending upon range time). Course Goals: To develop in the students the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude essential to the safe and efficient use of a handgun for protection of self and family, and to provide information on the law-abiding citizen's right to self-defense. Student Text: NRA Guide to the Basics of Personal Protection in the Home Course Lessons:

Lesson 1 - Introduction to Defensive Shooting

Lesson 2 - Basic Defensive Handgun Skills

Lesson 3 - Firearms and the Law: Possession, Ownership and the Use of Deadly Force

Lesson 4 - Strategies for Home Safety and Responding to a Violent Confrontation

Lesson 5 - Selecting a Handgun for Self-Defense

Lesson 6 - Sport Shooting Activities and Training Opportunities Lesson 7 - Course Review and Examination What to Bring: A safe attitude; eye and ear protection if you have them. Bring your own snacks and drinks. Students will bring their own revolver or semiautomatic pistol and minimum of 200 rounds of factory new ammunition (NO reloads). Dress comfortably and be prepared for both indoors and outdoors. What we will provide: Eye and ear protection; targets; enthusiasm; and a safe learning environment. A certificate of completion ("NRA Personal Protection in the Home") will be provided to each student who successfully completes the course.
