#### **LEGISLATIVE REPORT**

The worst Washington state legislative session for gun owners since, maybe ever, has with three anti-gun bills, **HB1240, HB1143 and SB5078** now law. Due to an emergency clause the effective bill, **HB1240** became when the Governor signed it. So not only can you no longer buy (or sell) America's favorite modern sporting rifle, but neither can you purchase replacement parts for the one you already own. You can legally keep the one you own and as a WA resident you are allowed to take it out of state and bring it back again. However, a person just moving to WA will be breaking the law if they bring their banned firearm in state, even a person being stationed here with the military.

Multiple lawsuits have been filed in state as well as federal court against the laws by the NRA, SAF, FPC, Aero Precision and several different gun shops. The SAF suit requests injunctions and if granted might open at least a window, if not a permanent opportunity to once again legally purchase firearms and parts.

We had some free fill dirt delivered that came out of the construction area south of the Sonic drive-in on Meridian. We used it to fill in spots behind the 200-yard target line and behind the action bays.
