FEBRUARY MEETING NOTES

Once again, the general meeting was cancelled due to the COVID-19 restrictions. We did hold a combination on-site/virtual board of directors meeting. We will start holding general meetings when the restrictions have eased a bit. We will put an announcement in the BullSheet when we can resume our general meetings.

Ed Cole informed us that the 2021 Puyallup Sportsman's Show, scheduled for March this year, has been cancelled.

Bob Wendt reports that they used the new electronic scoring targets during last CMP match. The result was that they completed the match in 2-1/2 hours instead of the usual 5 hours, allowing them to open the range up for general membership use earlier. The next high-power match, a 100-round standing match, will be Sunday March 7th. This match, the Cloward-Partee match, is the first official match of the high-power season. Used brass sales have been brisk the past few months. Darrell Behounek reports that he brought in \$520 in brass sales this month, and Dave Farrow sold another \$180 worth. All of the proceeds go towards the junior program.

On Sunday March 21st, the first long range 22 RF rifle match of the season will be held. This is a chance for all of us who have a 22 rifle to see how well we can shoot at longer distances. The muzzleloaders had eleven shooters show up for their annual January silhouette match. Their season is just getting started with matches on the last Sunday of each month. Check the calendar for exact times.

March is the start of the busy time of the year for the range. This month we have several matches impacting general membership use of the range, especially the rifle range. Please check the <u>online calendar</u> for the latest range availability before you come out to the range.

DUES AND INITIATION FEE INCREASES

After much discussion at previous board meetings, the board voted at the November meeting to increase the annual membership dues and the one-time new member initiation fees. For the past few years, the club has operated in the red. With prices of everything going up and the impact of the COVID restrictions on the range, the board felt it necessary to increase our fees, something we haven't done in many years.

Effective September 1, 2021, the annual membership dues will be increased to \$120. Existing 2020 members who have not yet renewed for 2021 will have the option of extending their membership, for up to 3 years, at the old \$96/year rate if the renewal is received by April 30, 2021. Those who have already renewed for 2021 will have the option to renew for up to 2 additional years at the existing rate if the renewal is received by April 30, 2021.

Effective as of January 2021, the one-time initiation fee for new members will increase to \$150 and the annual dues for new members will be \$120.

ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL UPDATE
