GUNS AND AMMO USED ON THE PISTOL RANGE

We have had several instances recently of members shooting Pistol Caliber Carbiners (PCC) on the pistol range. These guns are not allowed on the pistol range. The pistol range is for handguns only, firing traditional handgun cartridges. Handguns firing traditional rifle cartridges (223, 300BO, etc.) must be used on the rifle range. Air rifles and rimfire rifles chambered in 22 short, long, or long rifle, are the only rifles allowed on the pistol range.

ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL (ASI) ACTIVITIES

David Mamet's beloved quote, "Old age and treachery will always beat youth and exuberance" could be an apt metaphor for Action Shooting International's (ASI) 2nd Annual, "The Senior Classic", held at Paul Bunyan on October 1st. This match, opened to safe shooters of all ages, presented Olympics-styled medallion awards to the top competitors aged 50 and above and one below 50 years, top shooter with recognition as "Top Whippersnapper".

Senior categories ranged from Senior (50-59) Super Senior (60-69) Elder statesman (70 and above), recognizing both top 3 Optics and Iron sights. In addition, High Ladies, Most Accurate, Law Enforcement and Military received awards. Overall Senior winner earned a very special wood cane featuring a Grandpa Simpson engraved plate. However, surprisingly, the most coveted award was *Top Whippersnapper* – a nostalgic bronze baby shoe acquired from The Goodwill and customized by River's Edge Arms into a memorable trophy!

This year's The Senior Classic featured 7 new original stages some titled, "Help, I've Fallen!" featuring IDPA / ASI favorite prop "Annie – the CPR doll"; "Early Bird Special" a seated stage with an appetizing Menu from 'FUD' diner; "Piggly Wiggly Parking Lot Peril" where obscured targets are addressed while pushing a shopping cart; "Metamucil Rescue" featured the start position poised holding a plunger in a toilet; and lastly, "Arthritis Pain on The Range" a stationary stage where one hand grasps a walker while engaging targets one hand only...with limited scoring.

A total of 78 shooters accepted the challenge, including 23 registering as Whippersnapper. For New Shooter Orientation (NSO) 6 newbies completed the 45-minute presentation by ASI Match Director Joey Russo. We welcomed 12 ladies and hoping to see more in 2023.

Top Senior Shooter went to Larry Dechant and Top Whippersnapper honors went to Jonathan Tran!

ASI is a perfect introduction to moving and shooting sports. Regular scheduled matches feature stages from the ASI catalog and require around 2 boxes of ammo. Firearm calibers from .22 - .45 are accepted, as well as PCC at our range. No holster required as all stages feature table or low-ready starts. Generally, there are 6 to 7 stages. For specialty matches like this one, there's a bit more latitude for stage plans and fun props. New Shooter Orientation is available at 9 am in Bay 1, for new shooters, morning of match. Pre-registration is preferred on PracticeScore – find us under ASI at Paul Bunyan.

December 3rd will be the annual Toys 4 Tots, toy drive! In lieu of range fees we ask you bring a new, unwrapped toy or cash donation. These gifts will be combined with other Paul Bunyan toy drive items and donated to Pierce County's Toys 4 Tots toy drive. Last year, over 40,000 Pierce County children benefited from the community's generosity.
