LADIES SHOOTING LEAGUE COMPETES AT THE MOVEMBER MATCH

Movember Charity Match – usually held in November but switched up to September for chances of warmer weather – is a favorite match due to its USPSA Stages married up with IDPA scoring. Hosted by Renton Fish & Game and NWPPA, Movember offers shooters of different disciplines to compete for a good cause: Northwest Men's Health Defense, as all match fees are donated to this worthy group.

Five gals from Paul Bunyan's own Ladies Shooting League accepted the challenge once again, to compete in a new and fun 175 + round match of 8 stages. Walther Arms provided a steel framed Q5 Match for a pick-up gun that had everyone wishing to have one at the stage finish.

This Match offered a varied menu of stages from 'hoser - level' to 32 rounds of steel with 3 positions of fire. The steel stage, included the Texas Star, which was a new experience. One of two stages had a port requiring pulling on a line attached to a chicken drumstick prop to allow access to the targets on the other side. Question was, did it make sense to shoot one handed while pulling on rope with opposite hand or to grab the line high up and pull down and grasp the gun with both hands. Either method had a high success rate.

In the end, while waiting for scores to be tallied, a lively and entertaining discussion ensued. Laughter on the steel stage's use of sooo many bullets and relief from the usual rules hampering "The Fun" aspect of competitive shooting. Several of the gals mentioned enjoying this match more for its offering of breaking out of the IDPA and ASI structure; but it wasn't something they would want to compete in regularly. One termed it, "ASI on steroids!" Personally, I missed the reading of an IDPA scenario at the beginning of each stage; it helps in setting the mood.

All in all, it is a great match with something to offer the most seasoned, competitive shooter and to those just getting their feet in the shooting box. It is a match that does require some exposure to competition shooting; Movember

2020 is a year away – if it is something you'd be interested in joining in next year, there's no time like now to get brushed up on your skills here at Paul Bunyan – which offers IDPA, ASI and USPSA monthly matches.

ACTION SHOOTING INTERNATIONAL (ASI) UPDATE

Originally billed as “Antiques Roadshow Edition” – October’s match was a playful invitation to bring out the ‘ol Safe Queen or pistol that doesn’t see a lot of action during the year; of course, all pistols were welcomed, but this was a low round count match, accordingly.

This match offered a nice array of 6 shooting experiences – from “The Concession Stand” – a stationary stage to “In the Middle” which included lateral movement with a steel target and 5 paper targets. Shooters had the flexibility to shoot the 6 stages as they felt comfortable with – as allowed by rules: e.g. steel targets must be engaged at a certain location for safety or shooter choosing to engage a target stationary or moving.

Paul Bunyan’s Ladies Shooting League was well represented, expanding to two squads to shepherd newer shooters and their spouses and/or adult children. As such I was curious as to the increase in participation of women and couples / families in ASI since it was introduced in July. What I discovered was in July we had 6 couples / family members who shot the match and at this match we had 10! Nearly, doubling in under 4 months! Quite a testament.

Some of the more interesting pistols that arrived for the match were Ladies Shooting Leagues’, Vickie Jennings (Hudson 9mm), Carrie Parker (the lone gal with her SW Model 66), Jacquelyn Hallinan (Beretta Cheetah 86) and my Heckler and Koch P7 M8. Making a solo appearance was a Dan Wesson .45 and a brand-new Walther Match 5 won at the previous week’s Movember Match!

Once again, a BIG Thank You, to our dedicated group of volunteers who make ASI happen at Paul Bunyan: Birney Oxford – IDPA Coordinator and Master Class Target Creator; Steve Case –the Wizard of PracticeScore; Joey Russo – Maestro of Match Directors; Lars Linden – Stage and Bay coordinator and Mentor; Christa Beasley – Ladies Shooting League Coordinator.
