OCTOBER MEETING NOTES

Once again, the general meeting was cancelled due to the COVID-19 restrictions. We did hold a board of directors meeting upstairs in our airgun range.

Club member, Steve Clemo, was presented with the Worker of the Year at the last USPSA match. For many years, Steve has put in a lot of hours setting up courses for the USPSA matches as well as assisting with other duties to make sure these matches run smoothly. From all of the USPSA shooters:

Mark Voigt reported that, while the numbers were down this year due to the virus and the forest fire smoke in the air, we still did a lot of business for the hunter sight-in. 571 guns were put on the line for the sight-in this year, 96 fewer than last year, bringing in \$5710 to the club.

The informal airgun league starts November 4th. We will have the airgun range open every other Wednesday evening 6-8:30PM thru April. There is no real competition here, just getting in some trigger time indoors where it is warm. Darrell Behounek reported that he recently turned in \$550 to the junior club for the brass retrieved from the brass containers on the range.

All of our gate codes should now be working. We found an issue in the system on codes for renewing members, causing their codes to show up as expired. The system has now cut off codes for all who have not renewed their dues for 2021.

We have been finding a lot of spent brass in the trash recently. All spent brass or dud rounds should be placed in the red metal BRASS boxes on the rifle and pistol ranges. We will sort it by caliber and sell it, with the proceeds going to the junior club. Aluminum and steel cases should be placed in the 5 gallon buckets on each range. We also recycle spent primers, another thing we find in the trash a lot. If you have spent primers that you want to get rid of, leave them in a zip-lock bag or a container on top of the red BRASS containers or by the CONEX door.

Just bring your safe gun handling skills, a handgun of at least .22 caliber; a gun case or sleeve to transport you gun from stage to stage. 2 mags are desired, but 1 mag is okay. Plan on using 100 rounds of ammo for the match. Mag pouches or a handy pocket to place full magazines in.

The next ASI match is November 1st – Don't forget to set the clocks back 1 hour as the nation returns to standard time.

The next match is December 27 – a Sunday. Pre-registration is mandatory on PracticeScore. Find our matches listed under *ASI at Paul Bunyan*.
