## **SEPTEMBER MEETING NOTES**

Our new-to-us Kubota RTV was delivered last week. The older RTV that you see in use around the range gets a lot of use, often needed in more than one place at a time. Club member Rick Manley, who works at Jennings Equipment, kept an eye open for a good used machine that the club could purchase. He found a lightly used low-hour RTV that would suit our needs, so it was put to a vote, and passed, at the last general meeting. We will get many years of use out of the new RTV.

We have accepted a proposal for building new trophy display cases for the clubhouse. Our old clubhouse had built in and added-on trophy cases that were full. New cases were on the to-do list for the new clubhouse, but the search for someone to build them was a longer process than originally thought. Chief Executive Officer Dave Farrow will be the builder of four cabinets with a Christmas time projected delivery.

We will soon be replacing the target lights on the pistol range. The existing metal halide bulbs are expensive to operate and to replace, with few options. The new lights are LED which means cheaper operation and no waiting for the lights to warm up.

The November general and board meetings will be moved up one week to the 18<sup>th</sup> to accommodate the Thanksgiving holiday.

## **LONG RANGE SIGHT-IN**

On Friday October 14 from 9:00 AM to noon, we will have a Long-Range Sight-In opportunity. If you want to check your hunting rifle at 200, 300, 400 and possibly 500 yards this will be your chance. Each shooter will have time to shoot up to 10 shots at each distance. We start at 200 yards to make sure everyone has at least a basic zero. Sign in and set up will be from 8:00 to 9:00 with shooting starting at 9:00 AM. Because we will be shooting over the parking lot, all ranges will be closed during these hours.

This will be free for Paul Bunyan members and \$5 for non-members.

## CARETAKER'S REPORT

Some early morning rifle shooters are already firing up the wood stoves to keep the morning chill at bay. Our firewood racks are filled up in preparation for the cold winter ahead.

The paved road between the 100- and 200-yard target lines is in need of repairs. Many years of use and encroaching tree roots have buckled the road to the point where repairs are necessary. We are in the process of getting quotes for the ground prep and paving work done.

The new RTV is already being put to good use around the range. It is in very good condition with very low hours of use and will come in handy with its shorter but wider tilt bed. Due to a lack of covered storage, we are parking it in the target loft until we can come up with more suitable permanent storage.

We have a couple of truckloads of firewood available for sale at \$50 for a pick-up truck load. All wood is in log form, so bring your saw and have at it. Contact me if you would like to purchase some.

## M1-M1A-M1 CARBINE MATCH

On Saturday October 29<sup>th</sup>, Paul Bunyan will host an M1 Garand, M1A and M1 Carbine match on the rifle range. The Garands and M1As will be shot at 200 yards using the electronic scoring targets, and the carbines will be shot at 100 yards. The cost of the match will be \$15 for club members and \$20 for non-members, with factory ball ammunition provided by the club. 10 rounds standing, 10 rounds prone and 10 rounds off the bench with each gun is the course of fire. Shooters can also shoot sling supported prone, sitting, kneeling or off the bench. Up to 5 sighter shots will be allowed from the bench for the first stage.

For those members who do not have a Garand, we have a few to loan out for the match (arrange with Bob Wendt or Doug Nash prior to the match). Sign-in starts at 9am with first shots downrange at 10am. Positions 1-15 on the rifle range will remain open for general member use during the match.

## TARGET PLACEMENT

The result of placing your target or target backer on the frame like this:

The uprights get shot up along with the plywood. Please place your target or target backer between the 2"x2" uprights, not over them. This helps to reduce the cost of building and repairing target frames.
