Action Shooting International is a Shoot and Move Sport. It is a great introduction to competition or, for the experienced shooter, an opportunity to practice in a low stress environment. This is a low round count discipline – approximately 100 rounds and 6 stages.

Pre-registration is required on PracticeScore at ASI at Paul Bunyan due to squad size limits. Range fee is \$20. New shooters are welcome on a limited basis – email me @ corginationpistolteam@earthlink.net to request a slot for New Shooter Orientation (NSO) – a requirement prior to their first match. NSO is held in Bay 1 at 9 am on the morning of the match.

Our next match is Saturday, October 3. For the remainder of 2020 calendar, ASI will have matches on Sunday, November 1 and Sunday, December 27th. The 2021 calendar has not been set, so stand by, for those dates.

Billed as *The Hand Sized Handgun of the Realm – Both Real and Imagined* has been a staple for the NWPPA (Northwest Practical Pistol Association) for over 5 years. The premise is for those smaller framed guns to have the spotlight for an amusing match, although larger frame

guns are welcome, recognition goes to those fun-sized guns. Competing in this match were: Jackie Russo -Awarded Top Lady (Sig P320 subcompact); Marcie Bartlett (Sig P238); Jacquelyn Hallinan (Walther PPS M2); Carrie Parker (Springfield Armory EMP); Emily Streich (Sig P238).
