MUD, GONGS AND FLYING BIRDS- THE WSMA TRADE GUN FROLIC

As the black goo oozed out all over my hands and my gun, I thought back to the words of my Civil Engineering professor. "Dirt plus water equals mud. Mud plus more dirt equals more mud." Apparently, it's the same with gunpowder. In my attempts to swab the bore and keep my barrel clean, I oversoaked my patch and then poured dry powder down on top of the wet fouling. Two pulled balls and a slurry bath later, my gun was finally clean, and I was back in business at the Trade Gun Frolic.

The Frolic was held at Paul Bunyan July 31st during the last day of the heat wave. Eight shooters came to shoot their Northwest Trade Guns, a smooth bore flintlock popular as a trade item with the Indians back in the day.

Dwayne Anderson, our local Lewis and Clark reenactor, brought his military musket. The group would break down into three sections, with each section shooting a different event before rotating to the next station.

First for my section was the flyers, where Marty Kotzke, the Paul Bunyan Shotgun Match Director was on hand to operate the trap house. Guns were loaded with powder, wads, and birdshot, and each shooter had two chances to



try their hand at hitting a clay pigeon from each of the five stations, for a total of 10 shots. For those who think hitting a flying bird with a flintlock is difficult they're right, but this group proved it's possible as all eight shooters hit at least one

Scratch working on a powder horn bird.

The next event was the gongs, where each shooter would have two chances to try to hit each of five gongs. At 25 yards, there was the powder horn, the sock, and the rabbit, and at 35 yards was the heart and the buffalo. That may sound easy, but remember these guns have no rear sight or rifling. That patched round ball has to find its way to the target with just a little bit of magic. Each hit would count as 10 points, the same as each flyer that was hit.

The final event was the paper targets. For this, two bullseye targets were selected. The first is the California X, or a bullseye with an X imposed over the center. The other target was a straight bullseye target. Five shots were used for each target and the score determined by the scoring rings. To keep an eye on things Eric Burkhead was on hand as the RSO for both round ball events.

We also had two traders set up during the match. Scratch had his blanket and knives out and was working on the scrimshaw for a powder horn. Paul and Lehann Nelson had a small table set up and Lehann minded the store while Paul participated in the shoot. Both traders

were set up in the shade between the shotgun and rifle ranges and we decided that would be a good place to do the prize out.

The results are below. Being a WA State Muzzleloader's Association event, the top three shooters got a WSMA place medal, and also a chunk of lead in addition to their prize table pick. It was good to get out for a day of shooting, and we all realized we need more practice at the flyers.

The BONUS stage had a series of barrels where targets weren't visible immediately; requiring some 'peek-a-boo' shoot. A simple stage, but complex enough to task a seasoned participant. There were plenty of compliments so this style of a stage may see a recurrence in the near future.

Our next match will be October 1st – where we will host the 2nd annual **ASI's The Senior Classic**. There will be 7 humorously - themed Senior –stages to include: *Arthritis Pain on The Range*, *Piggly- Wiggly Peril*, *Help! Help! I've Fallen and Don't Fall for the Pigeon Drop Scam*, to mention a few. This will be a 100-round match, .22 to .45 caliber handguns only (No PCC). M1-M1A-M1 CARBINE MATCH

On Saturday October 29th, Paul Bunyan will host an M1 Garand, M1A and M1 Carbine match on the rifle range. The Garands and M1As will be shot at 200 yards using the electronic scoring targets, and the carbines will be shot at 100 yards. The cost of the match will be \$15 for club members and \$20 for non-members, with factory ball ammunition provided by the club. 10 rounds standing, 10 rounds prone and 10 rounds off the bench with each gun is the course of fire. Shooters can also shoot sling supported prone, sitting, kneeling or off the bench. Up to 5 sighter shots will be allowed from the bench for the first stage.

For those members who do not have a Garand, we have a few to loan out for the match (arrange with Bob Wendt or Doug Nash prior to the match). Sign-in starts at 9am with first shots downrange at 10am. Positions 1-15 on the rifle range will remain open for general member use during the match. We will have more details next month.
