AUGUST MEETING NOTES

MARTY KOTZKE WINS AWARD FOR HUNTER EDUCATION INSTRUCTOR OF THE YEAR

Long time Paul Bunyan Instructor Marty Kotzke was chosen for the annual Terry Hoffer Instructor of the year! Marty has been an Instructor for 15 years. He participated in over 20 classes in 2019, either as Chief Instructor, or supporting Instructor. Marty not only taught at Paul Bunyan but assisted in class all over Region 6! The criteria for the award, is how much the Instructor gives. Besides Hunter Education, and his other duties at the club, shotgun and BOD, Marty finds time to help everyone, especially me. Marty has traveled all over Western WA. helping put on training classes for new Instructors, and existing Instructors. He was instrumental in getting 27 new Instructors certified last year alone. Marty has taught to 1000's of students in Hunter Education, is a volunteer for anything I throw at him. He's a fixture at the Puyallup Sportsmen's Show, he participated in all of WDFW's National Hunting and Fishing Days. Sometimes 3 a year. Marty is always ready to help when ever asked, and even offers when not asked. He is the Vice chair for Washington YHEC participating at State and National events.

The selection process is WDFW hunter Ed. staff select the top 3 nominees and send it out to an independent group made up of Instructors, previous award winners, and Enforcement officers. Marty would never tell anyone about winning this award. Like most award winners, he's not into it for the "Glory", training our next generation of safe, legal and ethical hunters, seeing a kid pass and the smile on their face, is every instructor's reward.

Under normal circumstances we would have been announced this award at our annual In-Service Training in front of his fellow Instructors and received it at the Annual WDFW Award Ceremony that was supposed to take place in May. With the Pestilence upon the land, and limited gatherings, he will take part in the virtual Awards slated for September 23rd. This is the biggest award Hunter Education. gives, and couldn't have gone to a more deserving person! Congratulations Marty!

Marty is the third recipient of the Terry Hoffer Award to teach at Paul Bunyan, Ron Bauman in 1995, myself in 2007, and now Marty Kotzke 2019. I don't know of any other clubs with three winners.
