**QUALIFICATIONS TO RUN:** According to the City of New Orleans Home Rule Charter and Louisiana State Law, a candidate for Assessor must:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be a citizen of the United States
- Be a qualified elector and registered to vote in Orleans Parish
- Have been domiciled in New Orleans for at least two (2) years before the election
- Not have a felony conviction, unless civil rights have been formally restored

**RECOMMENDED EXPERIENCE & EDUCATION:** While there is no legal education requirement, effective Assessors' education may include:

- A degree in business, finance, public administration, urban planning, or real estate
- Certification in property assessment or appraisal (e.g., IAAO, Louisiana Real Estate Commission)
- Experience in real estate, valuation, property law, or municipal finance
- Skills in data analysis, mapping systems (GIS), tax law, and public communication

**© ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES:** The Assessor is responsible for the **identification**, **classification**, **and valuation** of all **real and personal property** in Orleans Parish for the purpose of **ad valorem taxation** (taxes based on property value). The Orleans Parish Assessor ensures fair and accurate property valuation for taxation and transparency:

- Maintaining up-to-date records of all taxable properties
- Determining fair market value in accordance with Louisiana law
- Applying exemptions, such as the homestead exemption, where eligible
- Submitting the annual assessment roll to the Louisiana Tax Commission
- Assisting the public with appeals, questions, and corrections
- **TYPICAL DAILY DUTIES:** The daily work of the Assessor's Office includes:
  - Conducting field inspections and property reviews
  - Reviewing building permits, deeds, plats, and sales data
  - Managing and updating parcel maps and digital records
  - Processing homestead exemption applications and change of ownership filings

- Collaborating with property owners, attorneys, and real estate professionals
- Responding to assessment appeals and inquiries
- Preparing reports for the city, Louisiana Tax Commission, and public

## QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER OF CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR OFFICE:

- 1. What will you do to make property assessments more transparent and accessible to the public?
- 2. How will you prevent unfair over-assessments that hurt longtime residents in gentrifying areas?
- 3. What reforms do you support to ensure homeowners are aware of their appeal rights?
- 4. How will your office help families understand homestead exemptions and other tax relief options?
- 5. What technology upgrades will you implement to improve efficiency and fairness in assessments?

**WHY THIS OFFICE MATTERS:** The Assessor plays a vital role in ensuring **equity**, **fairness**, **and transparency** in local government funding. Accurate assessment by the assessor:

• Determines the value of all property in Orleans Parish for tax purposes. Ensures fairness and accuracy in property assessments. It affects how much homeowners and businesses pay in property taxes.
