for a locally-owned business that could provide good food for a reasonable cost. We looked at several venues and did a cost analysis before choosing one.

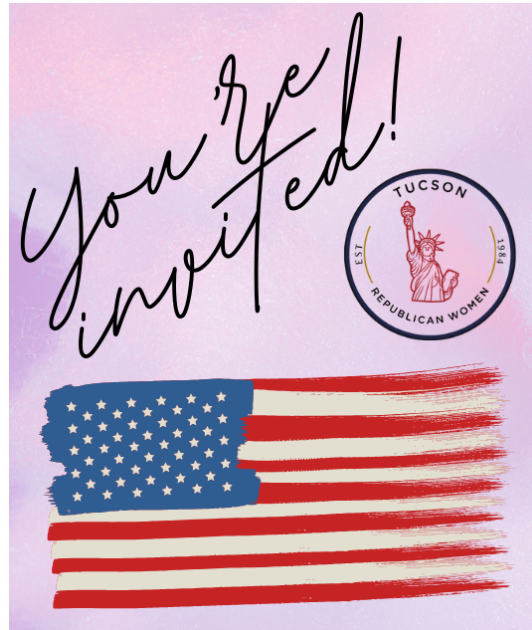

January's Speaker(s)

In 2026, Tucson and the surrounding area will be part of several important elections as part of Arizona's statewide election cycle. The state has multiple scheduled election dates, including a **March 10 special/local election, a May 19 local election, an August 4 partisan primary, and the November 3 general election**. We are going to be very busy this year!

At the **local level in Tucson and Pima County**, voters may see ballot measures and local offices on the ballot in the March and May elections, including regional transportation questions and other city or county propositions as they are qualified.

The **November 3, 2026 General Election** will include major statewide and federal contests that Tucson voters will participate in, such as U.S. House races (such as CD-6 with Juan Ciscomani and CD-7 with Daniel Buttirez), statewide executive offices like governor, secretary of state, attorney general, state treasurer, superintendent of public instruction, two seats on the Corporation Commission, and all seats in the Arizona Legislature.

In addition, local school board and municipal offices in Tucson and nearby jurisdictions will also appear on ballots in 2026, giving residents opportunities to shape both their local government and broader state and federal leadership.

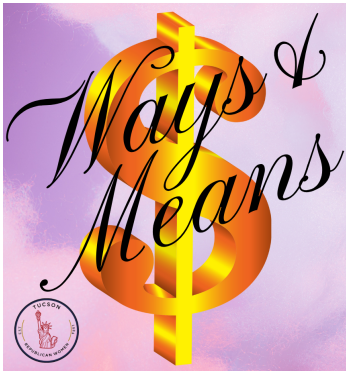
