TYPES OF VILLAINS

PURPOSE -MISDIRECTION -MAKE THE READER THINK THEY'VE GUESSED THE VILLAIN BEFORE THE AUTHOR TELLS THEM

TRAITS

- Appears guilty

- Has the means, motive and opportunity

Red Herring Villain Requirements

AUTHOR VS READER

DRIP FEED THE CLUES

Avoid putting a giant neon sign over your intended Red Herring by page 10 of the story

NOT TRULY INNOCENT

The Red Herring doesn't have to be innocent. They just have to be innocent of the crime they're accused of in this book




- It is possible to have more than one Red Herring per book. Be


Two Evil Villians One redemption


-Both killed the family/loved ones of main characters. -Both display lack of empathy and clear traits of megalomania -Both fought major battles with a main character at the climax of the story


Darth Vader killed the uber-villain at the top of the villain food chain and was therefore redeemed









