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This petition is a matter of urgency because the petitioners are an especially affected peoples who are 3-6 times more likely to die from the Coronavirus and the United States is ordering its children to commingle in school. Makes no provision for returning prisoners from its jails and does not make proper provisions for its homeless population nor for its citizens who have lost their employment and our facing mass evictions.

The Petitioner's request that the court give judicial notice that the petitioners are referred to as, "African-American" or "Black" while we are standing before this Commission as "Afro-descendants" pursuant to the definitions of the Inter-American system.

The petitioners are attaching additional video, files, and exhibits as evidence of our urgent request for humanitarian special measures to circumvent imminent, deadly, and irreparable injury to our citizenry.

The Rise of significant Covid-19 deaths in the Afro-descendant Population, a particularly distinct and segregated population requires imminent Action by the United States

On April 6, 2020 in a NY Times article by it medical journalist Linda Villarosa wrote, A Terrible Price: The deadly racial disparities of Covid 19 in America, noted that Louisiana became one of the first states to release Covid-19 data by race "While making up 33 percent of the population, African-Americans accounted for 70 percent of the dead. Louisiana the Code Tracking Project . Linda Villarosa of the New York Times also wrote that on April 8, 2020 a United States Center for Disease Control study suggested that about 90 percent of the most serious Covid-19 cases involve underlying health conditions — hypertension and cardiovascular disease, obesity, diabetes, chronic lung disease — that are more common and more deadly in black Americans and strike at younger ages. According to the C.D.C., the rate of diabetes is 66 percent higher in black Americans than in white Americans; the rate of hypertension is 49 percent higher. The average black life expectancy, from birth, is about 3.5 years lower than white life expectancy. In addition, the health outcomes of black Americans are by several measures on par with those of people in poorer countries with much less sophisticated medical systems and technology. And though these health disparities are certainly worsened by poverty, they are not erased by increased income and education

"We know the population we're describing has a high penetration of high blood pressure, obesity, diabetes, pre-existing cardiovascular disease, even heart failure," says Dr. Yancy. Dr. Yancy stresses the importance of continued commitment to serve the black community. "A in the rate of death for African Americans due to a now ubiquitous virus should be deemed unconscionable.

April 18, 2020 In Louisiana, 70.5% of deaths have occurred among black persons, who represent 32.2% of the state's population.<sup>7</sup> In Michigan, 33% of COVID-19 cases and 40% of deaths have occurred among black individuals, who represent 14% of the population.<sup>5</sup> If New York City has become the epicenter, this disproportionate burden is validated again in underrepresented minorities, especially blacks and now Hispanics, who have accounted for 28% and 34% of deaths, respectively (population representation: 22% and 29%, respectively).<sup>8</sup> Racial toll of virus grows even starker as more data emerges. 6. Johns Hopkins University and American Community Survey indicate that to date, of 131 predominantly black counties in the US, the infection rate is 137.5/100 000 and the death rate is 6.3/100 000. This infection rate is more than 3-fold higher than that in predominantly white counties. Moreover, this death rate for predominantly black counties is 6-fold higher than in predominantly white counties. Even though these data are preliminary and further study is warranted, the pattern is irrefutable: underrepresented minorities are developing COVID-19 infection more frequently and dying disproportionately.

Implicit Racial/Ethnic Bias Among Health Care Professionals and Its Influence on Health Care Outcomes

The discrimination in health care is an additional hurdle for Afro-descendant and ongoing issue in the United States since slavery and colonization. It

was not until after the 1954 Brown v. Board of Education that medical care very slowly began to admit Afro-descendant patients or hire Black Doctors. It was only fifty years ago when public care became less racially exclusionary. I am going to present a couple of instances in which black patients seeking care for the Coronavirus were turned away .

8. April 22, 2020 An Afro-descendant Detroit family is mourning a man they say was turned away from getting tested for the three times. "He was begging for his life, but no one would help him at all. Like they just kept sending him away," said Keith Gambrell, the stepson of 56-year-old Gary Fowler.

9. April 29, 2020 Afro-descendants have been discriminated against in testing and treatment. "A beloved 30-year-old middle school social studies teacher from Brooklyn has died of following a month-long battle, after twice being turned away for testing before eventually being diagnosed with the virus".

10. May 10, 2020 "Reginald Relf decided to fight through whatever was causing his nagging cough. But then his temperature spiked and his breathing became so labored that he reluctantly took his sister's advice to visit a doctor." .."The staff at an urgent care clinic in suburban Chicago sent him home, without testing him for Covid-19 but after advising him to quarantine. Mr. Relf, a 50-year-old African American engineer, settled into his mother's basement. A week later, after he was found dead". "Preliminary research by a Boston-based biotech firm suggests that treatment may not be consistent across the board. The study found that black people who visited hospitals with Covid-19 symptoms in February and March . Questions of Bias in Covid-19 Treatment Add to the Mourning for Black Families. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have advised health professionals to be on the lookout for medical bias.

June 21. 2020 At an indoor political rally in Tulsa, Oklahoma President Trump appearing where no face masks are required, Trump says he urged team to 'slow' COVID-19 testing: When you do testing to that extent, you are going to find more people, you will find more cases," Trump argued. "So, I said to my people 'slow the testing down.'

18. The United States has disrupted the petitioner's right to file this petition on over 10 occasions by cutting off his internet signal and disrupting his ability to teach Human Rights Defenders, input a password or receive the email resetting the password.

If the Trump Administration does not release immediate direct funding and self-management to the petitioners the petitioners will face a certain death or in the alternative severe physical, economic, and psychological injuries that will be irreparable.
