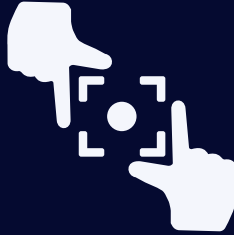

By formalizing the relationship between the client and the contractor early in the process, pre-construction agreements can help mitigate risks associated with the project.

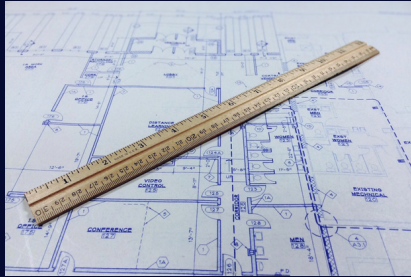
