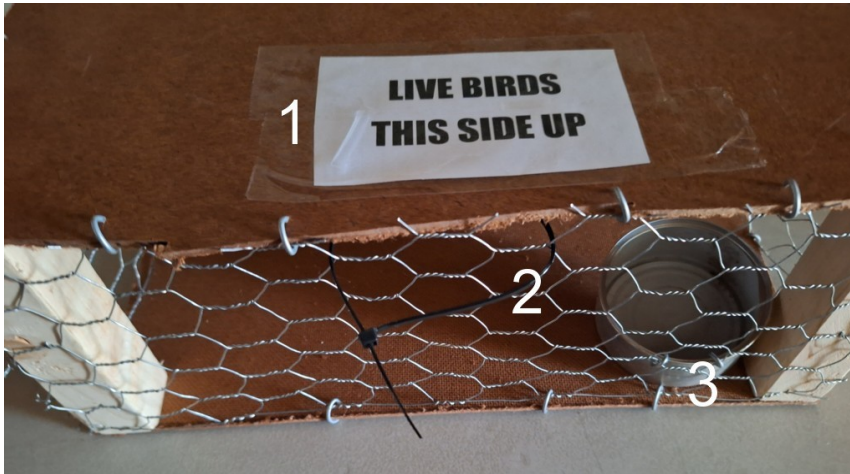


# USDA Cage Guidelines



1. All cages must have a Live Animal Sign affixes to the top of the cage.
2. All cages must have handles. These are 11" zip ties.
3. All cages must have metal or hard plastic feeders and waterers.

Live animal signs can be printed or written using a bold-tip sharpie on note cards. Use 11" zip-ties or pieces of twin to make handles on each side of the cage.



4. All cages must have an easy access door for quick removal of sick, injured or dead birds. This piece of loose wire can be zip-tied in place or hog ring. A pair of wire-cutters would be used to cut zip ties or ring.



5. Handles on each side.
6. Solid bottom to protect the bird's feet. Bedding will be placed in cage.
7. Cans for feed and water that are attached to the side of the cage.

This is a low-profile cage for a pair of quail. If they can get a spring and jump, they can injure themselves.
