

Executor's Beneficiary Tracing Checklist

Executors have a legal duty to ensure every heir is located before an estate is distributed. Missing a beneficiary can delay probate, cause disputes, or even result in personal liability. Use this checklist to ensure your search is thorough and defensible.

1. Review the Will
 □ Identify all named beneficiaries in the will □ Confirm spelling of names and addresses where available □ Check for codicils or updated versions of the will
2. Identify Potential Heirs (Intestacy Rules)
 □ Map family tree if the deceased died without a valid will □ Include estranged or distant relatives under intestacy law □ Confirm relationships with official documentation where possible
3. Collect Known Information
 □ Record last known addresses for each beneficiary □ Gather phone numbers, emails, or employer details if available □ Request supporting details from family, friends, or solicitors
4. Search Public Records
 □ Check the electoral roll for current addresses □ Search birth, marriage, and death registers □ Review property records for ownership or residency
5. Overseas Tracing
 □ Confirm whether beneficiaries have emigrated □ Check for dual citizenship or overseas records □ Engage international tracing agents if required
6. Verify Identity & Residency
 □ Confirm identities with passports, driving licences, or ID documents □ Verify current residence to avoid mistaken distributions □ Ensure details are cross-checked against official sources

7. Contact Attempts

□ Send letters to last known addresses

□ Attempt contact via phone/email if appropriate

□ Record all attempted communications

8. Professional Tracing

☐ Engage a private investigator for non-responsive or missing heirs

□ Request a formal tracing report (with verified evidence)

□ Retain a copy for the probate file

9. Probate Court Documentation

☐ Keep a record of all tracing steps taken

□ File supporting evidence with probate application if needed

☐ Ensure all actions are lawful and proportionate

10. Audit Trail

□ Keep copies of all correspondence, reports, and records

□ Store securely with executor's files

☐ Ensure transparency in case of legal challenges
