HE SUNDAY in Ordinary Time

February 12-13, 2022

Today's Gospel reading presents us with an immediate surprise; there are only 4 Beatitudes, and there are 4 Woes as well. We are more accustomed to the 8 Beatitudes of Matthew, and the woes are for another occasion. Luke also has Jesus speaking, not on the "mount" but on the "plain".

If we go to the first reading, we discover a similar contrast between the "cursed" and the "blessed"; "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings," and "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord". The strong contrast in both readings highlights the importance of the message and is not an unusual style of communication in the Bible. If we look at different translations, we would also find instead of "Blessed" the word "Happy," and instead of the word "Woe," we might find "Alas". These differences alert us to reflect deeply on the words before us and the content of the message. We always need the light of the Holy Spirit to perceive how God is talking to each of us personally in the Sacred writings.

Luke puts this sermon of Jesus not on a "mount" but a "stretch of level ground," indicating that Jesus meets us not from on high but at our level. He comes down from the mountain and speaks directly face to face with the crowd. Further detail appears in the statement "raising his eyes toward his disciples". It is unusual in the sense that He came down from the mount. Why would he then raise his eyes? A better translation is "Fixing his eyes on the disciples" or, as we have it in our Spanish translation, "mirando a sus discípulos". It is pretty clearly a personal encounter with all the disciples and, consequently, each of us.

The message is undoubtedly challenging and disturbing to our usual way of thinking – who wants to be poor? Or hungry or weeping or hated? As the "Fiddler on the Roof" pleads with God, "what's so wrong about being rich?" And then, when we are hated, despised, and persecuted, He commands us, "Rejoice and leap for joy on that day!" How rarely that happens in Church, except in Africa or maybe at Charismatic gatherings; we usually reserve it for a dramatic touchdown at the Super Bowl.

The teaching of Jesus turns our human values upside down; He often raises the bar for us to enter God's way of thinking. The poor, the hungry, the mourners, the persecuted are our brothers and sisters, not just the 'less advantaged' as we often condescendingly refer to them. We are all poor, we all thirst for something greater in life, we all need to mourn for our sins, we all feel rejection at some stage of our lives. The wonderful thing is that God loves us so much and that Jesus is the Lord and Savior of all.
