PARISH BULLETIN FEB. 27th, 2022

On this 8th Sunday of Ordinary Time, we get a reminder about Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent coming up on March 2nd. Furthermore, the ashes remind us of the need to do some penance, and maybe we say, "Yes, I do need to do a bit of penance." That is a good, healthy, Christian desire, but we do not always follow through on our goodwill or the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. In these Covid 19 times, we no longer see the sign of the cross made by the ashes on our foreheads.

It is just a sprinkle of the ashes on top of our heads, no longer visible in those who have a good head of hair and perhaps making us forget about the community aspect of this Lenten custom. We find encouragement by seeing the sign of the ashes on other foreheads.

That may seem to be another inevitable effect brought on by Covid 19 restrictions, or it can be a challenge to realize that our penance must go deeper than our foreheads and touch the heart. The hallmarks of Lent - prayer, fasting, and almsgiving- remain and will always be valid. We need to humbly investigate our lives and ask the Holy Spirit to help us change what needs to be changed and take sincere efforts to do so.

The temptations of Jesus in the Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent can help us look at our own lives; how am I dealing with i) money ('bread'), ii) power (authority), and vanity (spectacular action)? What are my temptations, and do I bring them to Jesus, my Savior? Getting to know Him better is undoubtedly a powerful aspect of our Lenten program. People also avail of daily Mass and the Stations of the Cross devotion growing in the knowledge of the Lord and themselves.

The goodness of our Savior shines out in His sufferings but also in the lovely images He presents in this Sunday's (8th Sunday in Ordinary Time) Gospel teaching. The two blind men helping one another and falling into a pit reminds us of folks like Laurel and Hardy; the speck and the beam in one's eye are obviously from His experience in Joseph's carpenter shop, and the good fruit from a good tree may be from Mary's care of their small garden.

Relax in the humanity of Jesus and enjoy a good Lent.
