Reflection for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

You are the light of the world. Mathew 5:14

On March 25, 1983, I was ordained a deacon. That summer I was assigned to Santa Cruz Parish. It was my first experience in parish ministry. I did my first baptisms that summer. One day, Fr. Anastasio Font, OCD, took me to Colossal Caves. When our guide had taken us a good distance into the cave, he turned out the lights. Whatever experience I previously had of darkness was nothing compared to the total darkness in that cave. It was eerie, scary, disorienting, even disturbing. In the 3rd verse of the Bible, God says, "Let there be light," and there was light." What a relief when the lights were turned back on. (I went back to Colossal Caves a couple of years ago with Fr. David Costello and was disappointed that they no longer turn the lights out. Something to do with safety, I suppose.)

What do you think of darkness? Is it a negative and scary thing? St. John of the Cross, whose statue you see in our church, wrote a poem about darkness. "One dark night, fired with love's urgent longings ah, the sheer grace! —I went out unseen, my house being now all stilled. In darkness, and secure, by the secret ladder, disguised,— ah, the sheer grace! —in darkness and concealment, my house being now all stilled." Just as night is cover for a lovers rendezvous with her beloved, so too, for St. John of the Cross the soul that is seeking union with God" walks by faith, not by sight," in a "cloud of unknowing." The light of faith is a supernatural light that is darkness to our natural way of understanding. We are secure when we go to God by faith even though it is like darkness to our normal way of seeing or understanding. "Understanding what?" you ask. Understanding life and what meaning it has for us, understanding God.

What, then, does our Lord mean when he says we are the light of the world? There are many beautiful verses in the Bible that talk about the divine light. "Blessed are those who walk in the light of your presence, Lord," Ps 89:15. "The people living in darkness have seen a great light," Is.9:2. The most important verse is what Jesus says of himself in the Gospel of John, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life," Jn.8:12. And again in John 9:5, "While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." Jesus says to those who claim to see by the light of their own knowledge, i.e. science, that they remain in their sins, cf. Jn. 9:41. Only by Christ our Light do we truly see. The Easter candle reminds us that Christ our Light dwells within us.

Chiaroscuro in art is the use of strong contrasts between light and dark, usually bold contrasts affecting a whole composition. Perhaps we need darkness in our life to accentuate the light. I suppose we need darkness to realize how wonderful the light of Christ is. When Jesus tells us that we are the light of the world, -that is awesome.

Again, John of the Cross: "O guiding night! O night more lovely than the dawn! O night that has united the Lover with his beloved." In the poetic language of the mystic the "guiding night" is leading us to the Light which is Christ. "In your light we see light," Ps.36:9.

"For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light," Eph. 5:8. "Just so, your light must shine before other," Mat. 5:16.
