

### FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT 2021

The fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday. Laetare means "rejoice" and it is like the middle Sunday of Advent, called Gaudete Sunday and meaning the same as our special Sunday of Lent. They are joyful, happy days, inspiring us to continue our journey of faith. Hopefully in this Lenten season, we are all trying to "REPENT" – to change our ways of thinking from merely human, limited or even sinful to God's way and to "BELIEVE IN THE GOOD NEWS" of the Gospel.

We join our Adult Catechumens (6 from our own parish), preparing for Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. With them we too try to scrutinize (The Second Scrutiny) or confront our lives by reflecting on the gospel of the Man Born Blind (John, chapter 9). Even if we are not attending the 10.00 am Mass for the RCIA catechumens it is very fruitful for all of us to read and reflect on that special Gospel during the coming week.

At the other Masses we celebrate the encounter of Jesus and Nicodemus and rejoice in the perhaps the most often-quoted words of the Gospel, **"For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have Eternal Life"** (John 3:16). We are also happy to hear that in Christ there is no condemnation – only mercy. We might also take away the words of St Paul in the second reading – "We are God's handiwork (His work of art), created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them".

Let us not forget the big feast days of March, the  $17^{\text{th}}$  – St Patrick, the  $19^{\text{th}}$  – St Joseph, and the  $25^{\text{th}}$  - the Annunciation. Fr Stephen has been giving us many inspiring reflections on St Joseph in his Flocknotes and we can all join the Novena in preparation for the feast day  $(11^{\text{th}}-19^{\text{th}})$ . But let us not forget about Patrick -not about green beer or the rivers of Boston and Chicago turning green on the  $17^{\text{th}}$ , but rather about his work of evangelization of the Irish, still needed today, and remember his own words to them as recorded in the Book of Armagh. His wish was that they would always treasure two short prayers, "Kyrie Eleison" and "Deo Gratias" or "Lord have mercy" and "Thanks be to God". It is between these that we will find the fullness of life – trusting in the One who loves us and eternally grateful for everything.

And if you know the melody try "Hail Glorious St Patrick"
