Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Feast Day July 16



Nuesta Señora del Carmen Día Festivo Julio 16

July 12th

Today we have in the Gospel the parable of the sower which Jesus spoke to the big crowd by the lake shore. Matthew, the Evangelist, gives us the parable, the questions of the disciples and the interpretation by Jesus Himself.

We know that great crowds followed Jesus and listened to His words. Many admired and praised His words – others walked away and no longer followed Him. We remember how Peter responded to the words of Jesus when He promised the Eucharist and many walked away. Jesus askes "What about you, do you want to go away too"? Peter answers "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the message of eternal life and we know and believe that you are the Holy One of God" (John 6:67-68)

After Jesus spoke the parable of the sower, the disciples wondered and asked him "why do you speak to them in parables" to which Jesus quoted the words of Isaiah "Gross is the heart of this people..." - not everyone cares to listen attentively, and then He interprets the parable. I think we can add that Jesus had a word for the PREACHERS as well as for the PEOPLE. Let us look at the 4 sowings:

- 1. The seed falls on the path: the fault is obviously with the careless sower. Why would he let the seed fall on a pathway? It's just for the birds!
- 2. The seed is sown on rocky ground: it is well received with joy but has no roots and does not last.
- 3. The seed is sown among thorns: it is heard and listened to willingly but then distracted by the cares of life family problems, making money, politics, taxes and entertainment it does not produce any fruit.
- 4. The seed is sown on good soil: the people listen, hear and understand; the message is put into action and produces good fruit -100, 60 and 30 fold.

Preachers – sow the seed of God's word; they must be well prepared, with study and prayer and with love and respect for the people.

People – are also called to have good hearts – to hear and listen and understand how to put the message into practice in everyday life, to build up the kingdom of God.

We are all called to pray for the preachers of the world, to give constructive comments and to let them know if their words are helpful.

We also give thanks for our people who prepare their hearts to listen attentively and ask the Holy Spirit to enable them to put the word of God into action in fruitful ways.
