

Reflection for the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be, Luke 12:33.

Today's Gospel continues the teaching of Jesus regarding possessions in chapter 12 of the Gospel according to Luke. We skipped over verses 22-31. In those verses Jesus says, "Consider the lilies, how they grow: they labor not, neither do they spin. But I say to you, not even Solomon in all his glory was clothed like one of these. Now if God clothe in this manner the grass that is today in the field, and tomorrow is cast into the oven; how much more you, O ye of little faith?"

Today's Gospel begins at verse thirty-two with Jesus telling his disciples: "Fear not, little flock, for it hath pleased your Father to give you a kingdom." In verse 33 Jesus resumes His teaching about possessions: "Sell what you possess and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach, nor moth destroy." In verse 34 He gives us that memorable saying: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Then Jesus tells another parable that has a similar message as last Sunday's Gospel parable about the rich man. The lesson is: "You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Peter then asks, "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" Jesus again stresses the necessity of being prepared to render an account of our stewardship of what has been entrusted to us by God saying, "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more," Lk. 12:48.

The Saturday before last I attend the funeral of the mother of Fr. Philip Sullivan, OCD. Some of you may know Fr. Philip since he served here at Santa Cruz Church little more than a decade ago. He said that his mom was preparing for death all the time. He quoted the Latin expression *momento mori* which means, "remember that you have to die." He said he and his mom frequently discussed together questions about life, death, Heaven and yes, even Hell, not as a morbid exercise but as a pragmatic preparation for paradise.

"Pragmatic preparations for paradise," is a lovely phrase. Jesus does not tell these parables about being prepared to render an account to our Creator how we have used his gifts to strike terror in us. However, it is terrible to hear in verse forty-seven that the servant who knew his master's will but did not prepare nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely. First there comes a warning to the disciples who knew their Lord's will, who had been told to watch for His coming, to prepare themselves and others for it. That "will" includes the use of all gifts.

We are living in a time when many do not seem to remember that they must die. If they do remember, it is not with any concern of being accountable to God for how they lived because they do not believe in God, or the immortality the soul and life beyond this earthly existence. But Truth has truly spoken, or there's nothing true: "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival."

Let us journey together in faith.
