Reflection for the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Though our Lord Jesus Christ was rich, he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich, 2Cor.8:9.

The Gospel for this Sunday tells the story of two men. One is rich and dresses in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. The other is a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores. I am sure you are familiar with the story. Like the story of the Prodigal Son which we heard a couple of Sundays ago, the story of poor Lazarus is only found in the Gospel of St. Luke. The story of the Good Samaritan, which we heard back on the 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time is also only in Luke. Let's take a moment to look at these three stories, unique to St. Luke's Gospel, to see how each story illuminates the others. The "Samaritan traveler" encounters a man alongside the road to Jericho beat up and half-dead and he is moved with compassion. The question the story addresses is, "Who is my neighbor?" The Samaritan is the true neighbor because he stopped to help the poor man who was half-dead. In the story of the prodigal son, it is the father who is prodigal in the way he lavishes mercy of his son. Now we come to today's story about Lazarus who was lying at the door of the rich man. He was covered with sores and would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. The rich man, like the people the prodigal son worked for, did not lift a figure to give him even scraps to eat. They both die but Lazarus rests in the bosom of Abraham whereas the rich man suffers tormenting flames. Abraham says, "'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented." It is, as they say, a reversal of fortunes. The words of Abraham echo the words spoken by the Lord when he said. "Woe to you who are rich, for you have already received your comfort, Lk.6:24. In the Lord's Sermon on the Mount he also speaks of those who have had their reward in this present life because they were full of self-love and self-interest, cf. Mt. 6: 2,5.

What a sight to see this rich man who lived sumptuously on earth, piteously pleading for but a single drop of water momentarily to cool the tip of his tongue and begging for it from a beggar to whom he had refused the crumbs of his table. This man once clothed in fine linen and purple garments is now wrapped in fiery flames and tortured with a maddening thirst. This is not a pretty picture. Water, water, one single drop of water. But it is too late, too late. The day for mercy has passed into the darkness of eternal night. Dives, the name tradition gives this rich man, once drank from the cup of pleasure. He had plenty of good things and misused them; plenty of opportunities and neglected them; so many chances and lost them, notably the special one that had been brought to his very gates.

The story of the rich man is the story of lost opportunity to do good, to do the works of mercy. The inaction of Dives is a sad contrast to the action taken by the good Samaritan. It might have gone better for him if he had lost everything like the prodigal son who came to his senses at last.

Let us do good while there is still time. How terrible are the words Our Lord puts into the mouth of Abraham who says to Dives, "Between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours." May we never hear God say, "You fool, it is too late now."

Let us journey together in faith, hope and love.
