

Reflection for the 23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Luke 14:27

As a pastor who must preach on the Gospel to his people every Sunday, I want to say, "Jesus, enough already! My parishioners are going to think your teachings are just too hard." In the past month we heard a parable about the unfaithful servant who was severely beaten and Jesus warning us that much will be required of the person entrusted with much. What was I supposed to say about that? The next week Jesus tells us that he came to set the earth on fire and how he wished it were already blazing. He said he did not come to establish peace on earth but division. How are we supposed to sing "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me?" Then the next Sunday when asked whether many will be saved, he answered that we must strive to enter through the narrow gate and that many will not be able to enter. Last week Jesus gave us the strange teaching that when we hold a lunch or a dinner, we are not invite our friends or our brothers, or our relatives, or our wealthy neighbors. Instead, we should invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind. In this way, he said, we would be blessed.

This Sunday Jesus tells us in the Gospel, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." I say to myself, "Jesus, how am supposed to preach on this teaching? You are not going to have any followers if I do."

I know what I will do. I will preach about the Blessed Virgin Mary. In August, two beautiful feasts of Mary gave me good material for my homily, saving me from preaching on those difficult Gospels. This first Sunday of September I can draw my parishioner's attention to the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Yes, her birthday is celebrated this Thursday, September 8. Although the Bible does not give an account of Mary's birth, there is a traditional story that Mary's parents, Anna and Joachim, were infertile. They prayed for a child and received the promise of a child who would advance God's plan of salvation for the world. This story, like so many stories in the Bible, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning. The Patron of the Diocese of Tucson, St. Augustine, whom I told you about last week, connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed."

The Blessed Virgin Mary is not divine, but she is full of grace. What's more, she is like us. She is our sister. She was entrusted with much. Her "YES" to God made our redemption possible. She inspires us to fearlessly put our gifts at the service of God. She knows that the fire Jesus wants to see blazing is the fire of love burning in our hearts as it does in hers. We are not to worry. She who is our sister has become our mother. We who are poor and spiritually blind and crippled, are brought under one roof by Our Blessed Mother. As one family of her divine Son, Mary comforts us and assures us that there can indeed be peace on earth if we keep her Son's new commandment of LOVE.

Mary, what does your Son mean when he tells us that unless we hate our father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even our own life, we cannot be a disciple of His? "Don't worry," she says. "Love will give you the answer."




