Message from the Pastor . . .

Dear Parishioners of Santa Cruz Parish,

On Monday, the Arizona State Supreme Court upheld an anti-abortion law passed in 1864 by the then Territory of Arizona. The law states:

"A person who provides, supplies or administers to a pregnant woman, or procures such woman to take any medicine, drugs or substance, or uses or employs any instrument or other means whatever, with intent thereby to procure the miscarriage of such woman, unless it is necessary to save her life, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not less than two years nor more than five years," [ARS 13-3603].

This law was incorporated into the state constitution when Arizona became a state in 1912. The federal government did not object, the other states did not protest and most importantly the people of Arizona accepted this law as just and right.

One of the objections I am hearing regarding the anti-abortion law is that it was passed in 1864 during the Civil War era. It's as if the age of a law and the passing of time, somehow means the law can no longer be applied to modern times. I can think of a set of laws that are over three thousand years and yet are still enforce among us as Christians—the Ten Commandments. The Fifth Commandment, "Thou shall not kill," (Ex 20:13), has not lost its force and indeed all of the Commandments retain their obligation of obedience for us in conscience. No one, no culture, no society, no system of government has the right or ability to undermine the validity and morality of the Ten Commandments. Our whole Judeo-Christian society is based on the acceptance and inviolability of these laws. The more we abandon these principles the more chaos will reign in our times.

What does a godless society look like? It is a society with no moral standards. If we believe in God, then we believe in His words and we strive to live according to His Word Made Flesh, Jesus Christ. Without this belief and faith, then all things are at the whim of society; and with no laws, society will do what it wants to do. Some signs of a godless society include: high divorce rates, youth experiencing the highest levels of depression in history, cycles of unhappiness, addiction to social media, and a level of dehumanizing others leading to a complete breakdown of society as Christians know it. I believe we are living in such a society. Our society is in chaos.

I also believe the true danger in the abortion vote that lies before us is not in outside forces of political parties and their influence, but rather in each one of us. How many of us Catholics vote in a way that supports the abortion agenda? How many of us are more faithful to a political party than we are to Jesus Christ and His way, His truth and His life? God's words are eternal and are meant to guide all peoples for all generations. I pray that when the time comes to make our voices heard that it will be voice of the Lord Jesus Christ that is proclaimed in defense of life.

Mensaje del Párroco . . .

Estimados Feligreses de la Parroquia de Santa Cruz,

El lunes, la Corte Suprema del Estado de Arizona confirmó una ley antiaborto aprobada en 1864 por el entonces Territorio de Arizona. La ley establece:

"Una persona que proporciona, suministra o administra a una mujer embarazada, o consigue que dicha mujer tome cualquier medicamento, droga o sustancia, o usa o emplea cualquier instrumento o otro medio, con la intención de provocar el aborto espontáneo de dicha mujer, a menos que es necesario para salvar su vida, será castigado con prisión en el penal estatal no menor de dos años ni mayor de cinco años" [ARS 13-3603].

Esta ley se incorporó a la constitución estatal cuando Arizona se convirtió en estado en 1912. El gobierno federal no se opuso, los otros estados no protestaron y, lo más importante, el pueblo de Arizona aceptó esta ley como justa y correcta.

Una de las objeciones que escuché con respecto a la ley antiaborto es que fue aprobada en 1864 durante la época de la Guerra Civil. Es como si la era de una ley y el paso del tiempo significaran de alguna manera que la ley ya no se puede aplicar a los tiempos modernos. Puedo pensar en un grupo de leyes que tienen más de tres mil años y aún se aplican entre nosotros como cristianos: los Diez Mandamientos. El Quinto Mandamiento, "No matarás" (Ex 20,13), no ha perdido su fuerza y de hecho todos los Mandamientos conservan para nosotros su obligación de obediencia en conciencia. Nadie, ninguna cultura, ninguna sociedad, ningún sistema de gobierno tiene el derecho o la capacidad de quebrantar la validez y la moralidad de los Diez Mandamientos. Toda nuestra sociedad judeocristiana se basa en la aceptación e inviolabilidad de estas leyes. Cuanto más abandonemos estos principios, más caos reinará en nuestros tiempos.

¿Cómo es una sociedad sin dios? Es una sociedad sin normas morales. Si creemos en Dios, entonces creemos en Sus palabras y nos esforzamos por vivir según Su Verbo hecho carne, Jesucristo. Sin esta creencia y fe, entonces todo depende del capricho de la sociedad; y sin leyes, la sociedad hará lo que quiera. Algunas señales de una sociedad sin dios incluyen: altos índices de divorcio, jóvenes que experimentan los niveles más altos de depresión en la historia, ciclos de infelicidad, adicción a las redes sociales y un nivel de deshumanización de los demás que conduce a un colapso total de la sociedad tal como la conocemos los cristianos. Creo que vivimos en una sociedad así. Nuestra sociedad está sumida en el caos.

También creo que el verdadero peligro en la votación del aborto que tenemos ante nosotros no está en las fuerzas externas de los partidos políticos y su influencia, sino en cada uno de nosotros. ¿Cuántos de nosotros, los católicos, votamos de una manera que apoye la agenda del aborto? ¿Cuántos de nosotros somos más fieles a un partido político que a Jesucristo y su camino, su verdad y su vida? Las palabras de Dios son eternas y están destinadas a guiar a todos los pueblos durante todas las generaciones. Rezo para que cuando llegue el momento de hacer oír las voces, sea la voz del Señor Jesucristo la que se proclame en defensa de la vida.



- If the abuse happened in Arizona, call the Police or Sheriff's Office in the specific area. If the abuse happened in any other state, call the Police or Sheriff's Office in the specific area of that state.
- Call the diocese in which the abuse happened. If the abuse happened in the Diocese of Tucson, call the Victim Assistance Program of the Diocese of Tucson 520-623-0344 or (1-800-234-0344 in Arizona) and/or the Office of Child, Adolescent and Adult Protection of the Diocese of Tucson at 520-838-2513.
