Message from the Pastor . . .

Dear Parishioners of Santa Cruz Parish,

We began the holy season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent is a forty day time of preparation for the celebration of Easter. In other words, Lent is not a season for its own sake, it is meant to look forward to rejoicing and thanking God for the mercy He shows us in sending His Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, to die and rise again for us! Everything we do for Lent is supposed to help us to purify our souls and bodies so as to enable us to live as true sons and daughters of God in our world. So the question we often ask each other and ourselves at Lent, is: "What are you giving up for Lent?"

The Church recommends to us three traditional disciplines during Lent: Prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Prayer is simply conversation with God, talking to God, spending time with God. We can do this in a multiplicity of ways. Going to daily Mass is the best possible prayer we can engage in. At Mass we acknowledge our sins, we intercede and petition God for the needs of others as well as our own needs, we praise and thank God at the consecration and communion of the Holy Eucharist. At Mass, Jesus Himself is present in the reading of the Word and in the Holy Eucharist, Jesus Himself gives Himself to us when we receive Holy Communion pouring out His love and mercy upon our souls and fulfills the promise to remain with us all our days. Prayer is also necessary apart from Mass. Using the meditations found in the Little Black Book during Lent will help us each day to focus our thoughts on God. Other forms of prayer include the Stations of the Cross, prayed every Friday at 6:30 p.m. in the church, praying the rosary daily, prayerful reading of the Gospels, and visiting the church in silence are all good ways of entering more deeply into conversation with God.

Fasting and abstinence means giving up something good for the best. We are called to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, i.e., one full meal for the day. Abstinence means refraining from eating meat on Fridays during Lent. The things we give up during Lent have to be things that are in themselves good and licit for us. We choose to give these things up for a while and choose to join Jesus as He fasts and prays in the desert for forty days. When we give up things we begin to realize how cluttered our lives are, how much stuff, how much junk we have in our lives. Fasting and abstaining helps us to realize that Jesus Christ is one thing we cannot do without.

Almsgiving means sharing with the needy and the poor out of our own financial means. By giving away some of our monies we are making an act of faith that God will provide and multiply generously the sacrifice we make for the needy. Giving charitably will ultimately be rewarded by God who said: "Come inherit the kingdom prepared for you . . . for what you did for the least of my brothers and sisters you did for Me."

Mensaje del Párroco . . .

Estimados Feligreses de la Parroquia Santa Cruz,

Comenzamos el tiempo santo de Cuaresma el Miércoles de Ceniza. La Cuaresma es un tiempo de cuarenta días de preparación para la celebración de la Pascua. ¡En otras palabras, la Cuaresma no es una temporada en sí misma, sino que está destinada a regocijarnos y agradecer a Dios por la misericordia que nos muestra al enviar a Su Hijo, Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, para morir y resucitar por nosotros! Se supone que todo lo que hacemos durante la Cuaresma nos ayudará a purificar nuestras almas y cuerpos para permitirnos vivir como verdaderos hijos e hijas de Dios en nuestro mundo. Entonces, la pregunta que nos hacemos a nosotros mismos y a unos y a otros durante la Cuaresma es: "¿A qué estás renunciando durante la Cuaresma?"

La Iglesia nos recomienda tres disciplinas tradicionales durante la Cuaresma: oración, ayuno y limosna. La oración es simplemente una conversación con Dios, hablar con Dios, pasar tiempo con Dios. Podemos hacer esto de muchas maneras. Ir a Misa diaria es la mejor oración posible que podemos hacer. En la Misa reconocemos nuestros pecados, intercedemos y pedimos a Dios por las necesidades de los demás así como por las nuestras, alabamos y agradecemos a Dios en la consagración y comunión de la Sagrada Eucaristía. En la Misa, Jesús mismo está presente en la lectura de la Palabra y en la Sagrada Eucaristía, Jesús mismo se entrega a nosotros cuando recibimos la Sagrada Comunión derramando su amor y misericordia sobre nuestras almas y cumple la promesa de permanecer con nosotros todos nuestros días. La oración también es necesaria aparte de la Misa. Utilizar las meditaciones que se encuentran en el Pequeño Libro Negro durante la Cuaresma nos ayudará cada día a centrar nuestros pensamientos en Dios. Otras formas de oración incluyen el Vía Crucis, rezado todos los viernes a las 6:30 p.m. en la iglesia, rezar el rosario diariamente, leer con oración los Evangelios y visitar la iglesia en silencio son buenas maneras de entrar más profundamente en una conversación con Dios.

El ayuno y la abstinencia significan renunciar a algo bueno para el bien. Estamos llamados a ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo, es decir, una comida completa para el día. La abstinencia significa abstenerse de comer carne los viernes durante la Cuaresma. Las cosas que dejamos durante la Cuaresma tienen que ser cosas que sean en sí mismas buenas y lícitas para nosotros. Elegimos renunciar a estas cosas por un tiempo y elegimos unirnos a Jesús cuando ayuno y ora en el desierto durante cuarenta días. Cuando renunciamos a cosas empezamos a darnos cuenta de lo desordenadas que están nuestras vidas, de cuántas cosas tenemos, cuánta basura tenemos en nuestras vidas. Ayunar y abstenerse nos ayuda a darnos cuenta de que Jesucristo es algo sin lo que no podemos vivir.

Dar limosna significa compartir con los necesitados y los pobres por nuestros propios medios económicos. Al donar parte de nuestro dinero, estamos haciendo un acto de fe en que Dios proveerá y multiplicará generosamente el sacrificio que hacemos por los necesitados. Dar caritativamente será recompensa por Dios, quien dijo: "Venid a heredar el reino preparado para vosotros . . . porque lo que hicisteis por el más pequeño de mis hermanos lo hicisteis por Mí."

- Call the diocese in which the abuse happened. If the abuse happened in the Diocese of Tucson, call the Victim Assistance Program of the Diocese of Tucson 520-623-0344 or (1-800-234-0344 in Arizona) and/or the Office of Child, Adolescent and Adult Protection of the Diocese of Tucson at 520-838-2513.
