Message from the Pastor . . .

Dear Parishioners of Santa Cruz Parish,

This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Lent and is known as *Lætare* Sunday, or Rejoice Sunday, because of the Entrance Antiphon: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast," (*Isaiah 66:10-11*). We are at the halfway point of Lent; three weeks remain. You will notice that the liturgical color for the celebration of Mass is rose, which is a lighter shade of violet. Violet is the color of penance and the season of Lent is a season of penance. To use the color rose indicates that while we continue in the penitential season of Lent, we pause to "rejoice" because the days of salvation are drawing near. The Paschal Mystery (the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ) is the source of our salvation and therefore the source of our rejoicing. Because the Lord Jesus died and rose again, we have hope, that as we die to ourselves and to our sins, we share in the new life of grace as sons and daughters of God our Father.

Next Sunday is the Fifth Sunday of Lent which was formerly known as Passion Sunday because the Passion of the Gospel of St. Matthew was read with the participation of the people. You will note that all the images of the saints and the Crucifix will be veiled. We cover the saints as a visual reminder that our sins brought about the suffering and the passion of the Lord. During those last two weeks of Lent we should renew and intensify our Lenten disciplines and sacrifices even if we may not have been perfectly faithful it is never too late to begin again.

The last Sunday of Lent is Palm Sunday officially known as Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. It is during this Mass that we begin the observance of Holy Week by blessing palms and processing into the church imitating the crowds who welcomed Jesus to Jerusalem. The Gospel of the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark will be solemnly proclaimed. Our participation in this proclamation makes us present along with past generations of Christians who have faithfully recalled and recognized our part in bringing about the death of the Lord on the holy Cross.

These next few weeks of Lent certainly offer us many opportunities to reflect and meditate on the Passion of the Lord. We should make every effort to go to confession before Holy Week so that we can more fruitfully participate in the service of the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, the days that Jesus won salvation for us.

Mensaje del Párroco . . .

Estimados Feligreses de la Parroquia Santa Cruz,

Este domingo es el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma y se conoce como domingo de *Lætare* o domingo de regocijo, debido a la antífona de entrada: "Alegraos con Jerusalén y regocijaos por ella, todos los que la amáis; rebosad de júbilo con ella, todos los que por ella hacéis duelo. Alégrate y sáciate de su pecho consolador" (*Isaías 66:10-11*). Estamos a la mitad del camino de la Cuaresma; nomás quedan tres semanas. Notarás que el color litúrgico para la celebración de la Misa es el rosa, que es un tono más claro del violeta. El violeta es el color de la penitencia y la temporada de Cuaresma es una temporada de penitencia. Usar el color rosa indica que mientras continuamos en el tiempo penitencial de la Cuaresma, hacemos una pausa para "regocijarnos" porque los días de salvación se acercan. El Misterio Pascual (la Pasión, Muerte, y Resurrección del Señor Jesucristo) es la fuente de nuestra salvación y por tanto la fuente de nuestro regocijo. Debido a que el Señor Jesús murió y resucitó, tenemos la esperanza, de que al morir a nosotros mismos y a nuestros pecados, compartamos la nueva vida de la gracia como hijos e hijas de Dios nuestro Padre.

El próximo domingo es el Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma que antiguamente se conocía como Domingo de Pasión porque se leyó la Pasión del Evangelio de San Mateo con la participación del pueblo. Notarás que todas las imágenes de los santos y del Crucifijo estarán cubiertas. Cubrimos a los santos como un recordatorio visual de que nuestros pecados provocaron el sufrimiento y la pasión del Señor. Durante estas dos últimas semanas de Cuaresma, debemos renovar e intensificar nuestras disciplinas y sacrificios cuaresmales. Incluso si no hemos sido perfectamente fieles, nunca es demasiado tarde para empezar de nuevo.

El último domingo de Cuaresma es el Domingo de Ramos conocido oficialmente como Domingo de Ramos de la Pasión del Señor. Es durante esta Misa que comenzamos la observancia de la Semana Santa bendiciendo las palmas y entrando en procesión a la iglesia imitando a las multitudes que dieron la bienvenida a Jesús a Jerusalén. Se proclamará solemnemente el Evangelio de la Pasión de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo según San Marcos. Nuestra participación en esta proclamación nos hace presentes junto con las generaciones pasadas de cristianos que han recordado y reconocido fielmente nuestra parte en provocar la muerte del Señor en la santa Cruz.

Estas próximas semanas de Cuaresma ciertamente nos ofrecen muchas oportunidades para reflexionar y meditar sobre la Pasión del Señor. Debemos hacer todo lo posible por confesarnos antes de la Semana Santa para que podamos participar más fructíferamente en el servicio del Sagrado Triduo del Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo, y Sábado de Gloria, los días en que Jesús ganó la salvación para nosotros.
