Message from the Pastor . . .

Dear Parishioners of Santa Cruz Parish,

We have come to the last two Sundays of Lent. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the last Sunday of Lent and the beginning of Holy Week. Holy Week is the most important week of the year in the life of the faith. It is during this week that our Lord Jesus Christ accomplishes the work for which He was sent by our heavenly Father: to suffer, die and rise again for our salvation. Holy Week needs to be different for us as Catholics, it can't just be another week out of our year.

Palm Sunday sets the tone for the week. We begin by taking up blessed palm branches and imitate the crowds that welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem almost two thousand years ago. During the Mass the Passion according to St. Mark will be read, an object of meditation for us throughout the week. I remember growing up, we were not allowed to turn the TV on, nor listen to the radio or music. It was almost like a time of mourning. And that certainly made the week different from all other weeks. Embracing silence during Holy Week might be a good way to show respect for the suffering of the Lord.

The three holiest days of the year come at the end of this week: the Sacred Triduum (three days). Holy Thursday evening, Good Friday and Holy Saturday Vigil comprise the Sacred Triduum in which we celebrate the Lord instituting of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper for the first time, ordaining the Apostles as priests to carry on this institution in His memory, and the giving of the commandment that we love one another. On Good Friday no Mass is celebrated. We come together at 3:00 p.m. to celebrate the Solemn Passion of the Lord, to venerate the wood of the Holy Cross and to receive in Holy Communion the Lord Jesus Christ. We will also celebrate the Passion in Spanish at 7:30 p.m. that same day. On Holy Saturday during the day, again no Mass is celebrated as we keep vigil for the Lord's Resurrection. The Easter Vigil begins on Holy Saturday evening at 7:30 p.m. At this Mass we bless the Easter Fire and light the new Paschal Candle. We keep a long vigil of readings (seven readings with their psalms), and we celebrate the baptism and the renewal of our baptismal promises. This year our parish has the particular joy and blessing of initiating a new member into the Catholic Church, Will Howell. He will be baptized, confirmed and receive Holy Communion at this Mass. For each one of us, after having prepared during the season of Lent, we come to the moment of the renewal of our Baptismal Promises. Expressing our faith in God and His Church by turning away from sin and living out our faith.

It is never too late to get spiritually prepared for the celebration of Holy Week and Easter. Even if during these weeks of Lent we did not do everything we had proposed, we can renew our efforts this week and Holy Week. I pray that we will come together in the practice of our Catholic Faith and be worthy of the grace and blessing of the Lord.

Mensaje del Párroco . . .

Estimados Feligreses de la Parroquia Santa Cruz,

Hemos llegado a los dos últimos domingos de Cuaresma. El próximo domingo es el Domingo de Ramos, y el último domingo de Cuaresma y el comienzo de la Semana Santa. La Semana Santa es la semana más importante del año en la vida de la fe. Es durante esta semana que nuestro Señor Jesucristo cumple la obra para la cual fue enviado por nuestro Padre celestial: sufrir, morir, y resucitar para nuestra salvación. La Semana Santa debe ser diferente para nosotros como católicos; no puede ser simplemente una semana más de nuestro año.

El Domingo de Ramos marca el entone de la semana. Comenzamos tomando ramas de palma benditas e imitando a las multitudes que recibieron a Jesús en Jerusalén hace casi dos mil años. Durante la Misa se leerá la Pasión según San Marcos, objeto de meditación para nosotros durante toda la semana. Recuerdo que cuando era niño no nos permitían prender la televisión, ni escuchar el radio, ni escuchar música. Era casi como un tiempo de luto. Y eso ciertamente hizo que la semana fuera diferente de todas las demás. Adoptar el silencio durante la Semana Santa puede ser una buena manera de mostrar respeto por el sufrimiento del Señor.

Al final de esta semana llegan los tres días más santos del año: el Triduo Sagrado (tres días). La tarde del Jueves Santo, el Viernes Santo y la Vigilia del Sábado Santo abarcan el Sagrado Triduo en el que celebramos al Señor instituyendo por primera vez la Sagrada Eucaristía en la Última Cena, ordenando a los Apóstoles como sacerdotes para llevar a cabo esta institución en Su memoria, y la entrega del mandamiento de que nos amemos unos a otros. El Viernes Santo no se celebra Misa. Nos reunimos a las 3:00 p.m. a celebrar la Solemne Pasión del Señor, venerar el madero de la Santa Cruz y recibir en la Sagrada Comunión al Señor Jesucristo. También celebraremos la Pasión en español a las 7:30 p.m. ese mismo día. El Sábado Santo durante el día, nuevamente no se celebra Misa mientras mantenemos vigilia por la Resurrección del Señor. La Vigilia Pascual comienza el Sábado Santo por la tarde a las 7:30 p.m. En esta Misa bendecimos el Fuego Pascual y encendemos el nuevo Cirio Pascual. Mantenemos una larga vigilia de lecturas (siete lecturas con sus salmos), y celebramos el bautismo y la renovación de nuestras promesas bautismales. Este año nuestra parroquia tiene la alegría y la bendición particular de iniciar a un nuevo miembro en la Iglesia Católica, Will Howell. Will será Bautizado, Confirmado y recibirá la Sagrada Comunión en esta Misa. Para cada uno de nosotros, después de habernos preparado durante el tiempo de la Cuaresma, llegamos al momento de la renovación de nuestras Promesas Bautismales, expresando nuestra fe en Dios y Su Iglesia, alejándonos del pecado y viviendo nuestra fe.

Nunca es demasiado tarde para prepararse espiritualmente para la celebración de la Semana Santa y la Pascua. Aunque durante estas semanas de Cuaresma no hayamos hecho todo lo que nos habíamos propuesto, podemos renovar nuestros esfuerzos esta semana y la Semana Santa. Rezo para que nos unamos en la práctica de nuestra fe Católica y seamos dignos de la gracia y la bendición del Señor.
