"To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."

Luke 6:27

Reflection for the 7th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, Lk.6:27-29.

Loving one's enemies and turning the other check are hallmarks of the followers of Christ, or, at least, they are supposed to be. Oh, how difficult it is to practice the teachings of our Divine Teacher and Savior, Jesus Christ. At last Sunday's Gospel proclamation, we listened to the Divine Teacher say, "Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice and leap for joy on that day!" What kind of teaching is this? It almost seems unnatural and inhuman. The lessons we get from politics, culture and entertainment these days is that we should avenge ourselves for the harm or injustice done to us. And why not? In fact, revenge is not a modern passion. Revenge has played its part in all of human history. That is why Jesus' teaching is so, well, revolutionary. But is it unnatural and inhuman? No, it is not. Jesus, the Son of God, assumed our humanity to redeem our humanity, to rehabilitate our human nature. Love and forgiveness are the means He uses and wants us to use for His work of redemption. Yes, this is the essence of Christianity- to redeem the human person and restore dignity to the human family as God always intended. The prophecy of Zechariah about his son, St. John the Baptist, speaks for all Christians when he says, "You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Highest; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace."

The love that can forgive sins is a witness to the Savior Jesus Christ who died to save us from our sins. As disciples of Christ this is our mission. Does the practice of the Christian religion mean that we ignore, or are unconcerned about the injustice in this world and the inhumanity that is so characteristic of our fallen nature? Does it mean that we can not be "warriors for justice?" No, it does not. Christian discipleship entails the practice of every virtue, and justice is the queen of moral virtues. But Christian discipleship distinguishes itself by the supreme value of love of one's enemies. Why? Because we are all sinners and fall short of the glory of God. My enemy here on earth may be my boon companion in heaven. We are not so different from our "enemies". We are human and so are they. We are sinners and so are they. By praying for our enemies, we are acknowledging this truth. Our Savior Jesus Christ is their Savior too. We pray that they will accept His love. Please, God, we ourselves have accepted your love.
