Reflection for the 7th Sunday of Easter May 14th The Ascension of the Lord

He calls his Sheep and leads Them

This Sunday we celebrate the glorious Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. For forty days since his Resurrection, Jesus has been giving his apostles, his church, last instructions on what is to be their mission and how they are to carry it out. And now he leaves them and ascends into heaven.

But in the Gospel for today he states, "Behold I am with you always". How does this reconcile with his withdrawing his physical presence? We'll address that in a while. One way to understand the Ascension is to recall the image of the Good Shepherd. A shepherd cares for his sheep and protects them. But besides these, one of his main duties is to "lead" his sheep. He leads them to greener pastures. Psalm 23 alludes to this, "He leads me to safe waters" and "He leads me in right paths". The shepherd calls to his sheep. They recognize his voice and follow him. He leads them to all things that are good for them.

And where does Jesus lead us? In the Ascension, we see that ultimately, he leads us to heaven, to the joy of eternal life. That is our destiny. We were created to seek God, to come to experience Him and Love Him and ultimately to be with the Beloved forever. We are hard-wired to long for Him, to find fulfillment only in Him. Nothing else can satisfy. We might seek worldly treasures, pleasures, and honors but nothing truly gives us real joy. We were meant for heaven and to be with God.

And Jesus the good shepherd shows us the way. He leads us to our real destiny. The average life span in the United States is 76.4 years. That's just a blink of the eye compared to eternity. Psalm 10 refers to this "The days of our life are seventy years, or perhaps eighty, if we are strong; ...and they are soon gone".

Jesus by his life, death, resurrection, and now ascension shows us and leads to real joy, to eternal life. And it's not just that He shows us the way. There are many wise sages that teach us how to live well, how to find so-called fulfillment. Jesus is different. He doesn't just teach us the way to eternal life, He "is" the way. The purpose of our existence here on earth is to hear His voice and follow Him. And today he shows us our final destiny.

But what about this physical separation? Didn't He promise to remain with us always? This reality is He is present to us in numerous ways. But two, in particular, stand out. First, He sends the Holy Spirit to continue to shepherd us, to guide us and lead us. In John Chapter 17 he states, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you." We are not alone; we have His Spirit. And we will celebrate the Spirit's coming at Pentecost next Sunday.

And secondly, we have Jesus real presence in the Eucharist. A recent **Pew** Research study found that just 31% of U.S. Catholics they surveyed believe that the bread and wine used in the Eucharist become the body and blood of Jesus. How sad. We have a treasure beyond imagining in Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist. He fulfills His promise to remain with us forever.

This Solemnity is a good opportunity for us to step back and take a look at the big picture. Our life here is a brief journey. Our real destiny is clearly marked out by Jesus at His Ascension. Yes, we need to take care of earthly needs such as food, shelter, health, and employment. But of greater importance is to consider how we are to pass eternity. We need to turn to Jesus who is the way, the truth, and the life. We need to follow His lead.
